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FOREWORD

Simultaneous General Elections 2019 in Odisha for election to the 17th Lok Sabha and 16th Odisha Legislative Assembly was held in four phases during April 2019. The sheer scale of the democratic exercise commencing from the revision of Photo Electoral Rolls and culminating with the declaration of results is a challenging job. During this journey, the election Acts and rules as laid down by Parliament and the procedure and guidelines mandated by the Election Commission of India was followed scrupulously with clockwork precision.

In Odisha, LWE areas in the west and south, politically sensitive coastal districts, limitations of logistics like manpower, vehicles, resources in some districts, communication shadow areas, aggressive posturing of leading political parties etc. posed a challenge. The conduct of Simultaneous elections itself was a daunting task due to the increased requirement of EVMs, transport of EVMs from six different States, election materials, strong room space and training of polling personnel for the joint elections.

During the run up to the elections, as part of preparatory work, emphasis was laid on training and capacity building of all election related officials (from the DEOs and Returning Officers down to the polling personnel); EVM- VVPAT hands on, EVM- VVPAT awareness programme at the village level as VVPATs were being used for the first time in the State; inclusion of eligible youth and PwD voters in the electoral roll; flagging of PwD voters and voter awareness programmes. During the election process, enforcement of Model Code of Conduct and election expenditure, and adherence to Commission's instructions was strictly monitored.

This election saw many IT related innovations/ interventions like automation of daily Law and Order and EEM / MCC reports, mobile based EVM Vehicle Tracking system, C-Vigil / Voter Helpline/ PwD application, counting data monitoring system and monitoring through Google document sheets.

The theme of this election being “Accessible and Inclusive Elections”, all out efforts were taken to register left out and eligible PwD voters in the electoral roll. Provision of facilities like “SakshamVaahan” to transport PwD voters from their homes to the polling stations and back, wheelchairs, volunteers, Braille dummy ballot sheets, voter awareness posters and Assured Minimum Facilities (AMF) at the polling stations not only helped the PwD voters but all voters in general.

This Report is an attempt to compile, document and record the entire gamut of election activities. The Chapter-wise narrative chronicles the planning and efforts behind each activity/ programme. The statistical tables and Annexures provide facts and figures for future reference and election planning.

I would like to place on record my gratitude to the officers of the Commission for guiding us through the rough paths which were encountered intermittently. I offer my gratitude to my fellow Chief Electoral Officers for sharing their experiences and good practices some of which were adopted by us too.

My sincere thanks to the officers and staff of the office of Chief Electoral Officer for standing up to the challenging job, and assist in conduct of the General Elections smoothly and peacefully, without any major incidents. I take this opportunity to express my sincere thanks to the political parties, Government Departments, Police, Government Press, Media, SVEEP partners like NSS, NCC, NYKS, Bharat Scouts and Guides, Odisha Election Watch, CSOs and NGOs working in the field of voter awareness and disability, and especially the electors of Odisha, for being a part of the World's largest democratic exercise.

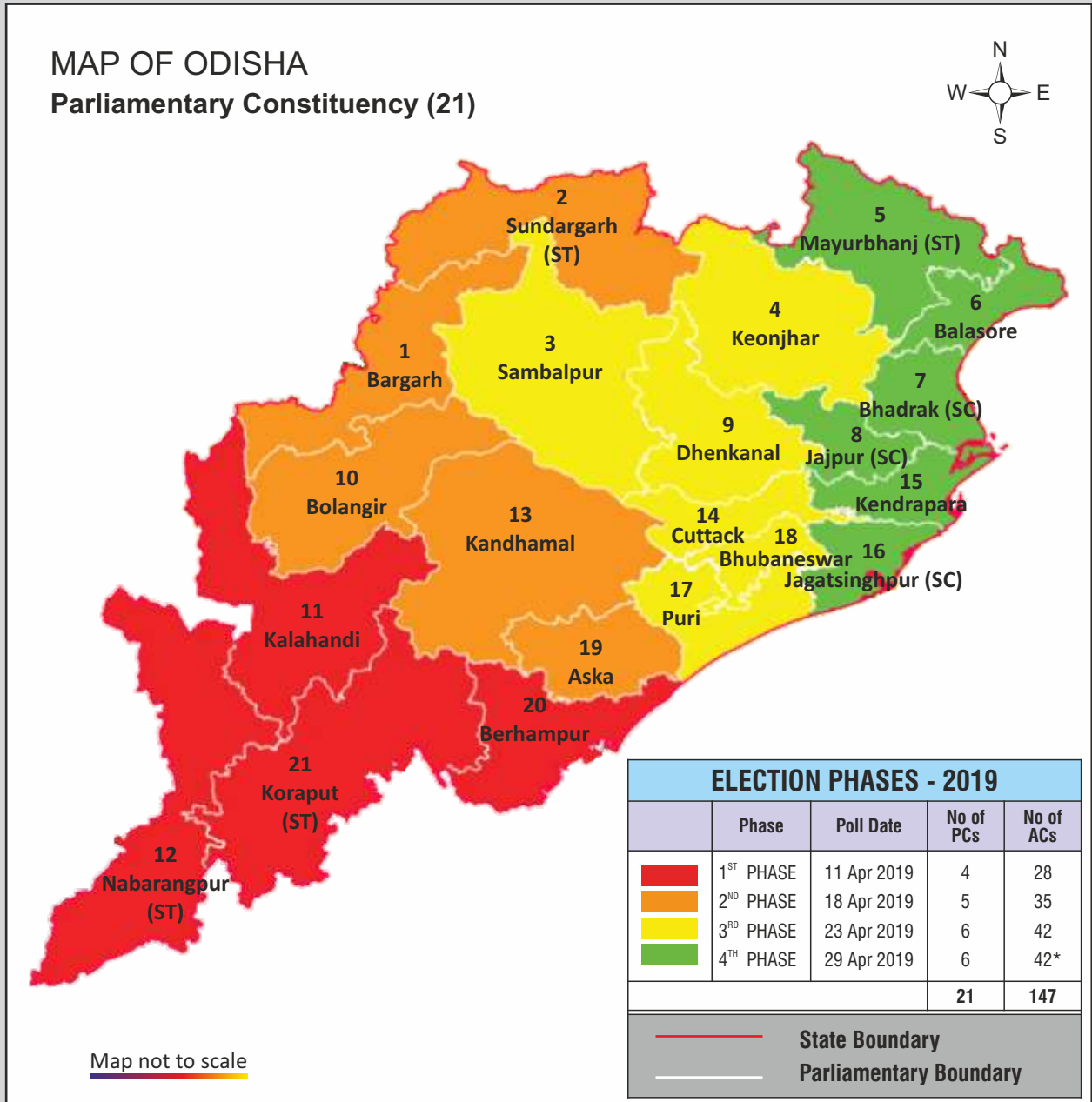

Photo Electoral Rolls

Special Summary Revision of Photo Electoral Roll with reference to 01.01.2019 as qualifying date

- The Draft publication of Photo Electoral Roll w.r.t. 01.01.2019 as qualifying date for all the 147 Assembly Constituencies of State of Odisha was done on 01.09.2018.
- The Draft Photo Electoral Roll was shared with all the eight recognized political parties (both hard and soft copies)
- Special Campaign Days were held on 23.09.2018, 07.10.2018 and 28.10.2018 (all Sundays) in all the 37606 polling stations across the State.
- 5th October 2018 was observed as Special Campaign Day for Persons With Disabilities in all Gram Panchayats of the State.
- The number of receipt of claims and objections received till 15.11.2018 was as follows:

Pre-Revision Activities

As preparatory activities for the Special Summary Revision, 2019, Chief Electoral Officer, Odisha held Video Conference with all DEOs & EROs on 04.05.2018, 07.05.2018, 28.06.2018 and 26.07.2018.

After draft publication of Photo Electoral Rolls on 1st September 2018, CEO, Odisha reviewed the progress on 11.09.2018 through Video Conference.

Removal of Demographically Similar Entries

Out of 9,02,792 DSEs, received through the ERONET, the EROs completed desk verification of all the DSEs and found 2,97,323 number of DSEs as doubtful and matching. After field verification by BLOs, 1,80,391 number of electors were identified for deletion following due procedure. The number of DSEs as on the date of final publication on 21.01.2019 was 49,078.



Removal of Logical Errors

The number of logical errors was 66,847 as seen in ERONET on the date of draft publication. During the period of Special Summary Revision of Photo Electoral Rolls, after conducting field inquiry

wherever required and correction of the errors, the number of logical errors was brought down to 2,854 in the final publication.

Flagging of PwD Electors

During the period of Summary Revision, 1.83 lakh voters were flagged in the Photo Electoral Roll as PwD voters. However, during continuous updation of rolls, flagging of PwD voters continued and there were 5,56,458 PwD voters flagged in the e-roll at the time of elections.

Flagging of VIP electors

A total of 32,176 number of electors were flagged as VIP electors by the Electoral Registration Officers during the Summary Revision programme.

Meeting with recognised Political Parties

CEO, Odisha held meeting with political parties on 30.08.2018 (before Draft Publication) and later again on 05.10.2018. CEO held press briefing on 01.09.2018 and several times during the revision programme.

BLO, BLA meetings were held twice during 20th December, 2018 and 22nd December, 2018 to identify left out voters and also take their feedbacks regarding form - 6, 7, 8 & 8 - A.

Review and Monitoring

Important parameters of the SSR- 2019 like enrolment of young voters, flagging of PwDs, removal of DSE and dead voters were monitored on a daily basis through google documents created for this purpose.

CEO Odisha reviewed the progress of Summary Revision activities in the districts of Northern Division



on 09.08.2018 and 11.12.2018. Summary Revision activities in the districts of Southern Division were reviewed on 25.08.2018 and 12.12.2018. Review of



Summary Revision activities in the districts of Central Division was held on 13.12.2018.

The following outreach activities/ multimedia campaigns were taken up during SSR, 2019.

- Display advertisements through leading local news papers
- Announcements/ jingles through All India Radio and FM Channels
- Scroll News through Door Darshan and leading 10



- local TV Channels
- Video Spots through Door Darshan and Private TV Channels
- Bulk SMS sent to 84 lakh subscribers
- Display of standardised Posters at GP, ERO, DEO offices and other conspicuous locations.
- Distribution of leaflets through news papers
- More than 4600 calls were received through Toll Free Number 1950.



ELC Activities

State level workshop of NSS Programme officers was held on 23.08.2018 at Utkal University, Bhubaneswar and NYK Coordinators on 05.09.2018. 3952 ELC clubs were established at Institutional levels and 24,506 Chunav Pathshalas at Community/ Polling Station level. Besides, 772 Voter Awareness Forums were functional in Governmental/ Non-Governmental offices.

The ELC Resource Guide “Chunav Pathasala” was translated into Odia and distributed to all BLOs. The Resource Guide for Colleges was translated into

Odia and distributed to all ELC partner agencies like NSS, NYK, NCC, Bharat Scouts and Guides and Odisha Election Watch.

Supervision and Monitoring

Eight Electoral Roll Observers were appointed by the Election Commission. They visited the districts assigned to them three times during the roll revision programme and submitted their visit reports to the Commission. Further, senior officers of the CEO Office visited the districts on Special Campaign Days and reviewed the progress of receipt of claims and objections.

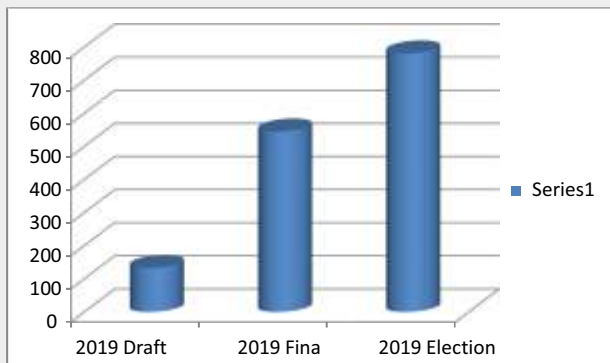

Improvements in the Electoral Roll

There were 3,18,00,787 electors in the Draft Roll 2019 published on 01.09.2018. The names of 18,60,375 voters were added in the electoral roll during the period from 1st September 2018 till the last date of filing nominations during the GE 2019, which is 5.85% of the electors in the draft roll. The names of 6,73,134 electors were deleted during the same period which is 2.11% of the electors. Corrections in the electors entries were made in case of 7,92,369 electors. Names of 15182 service voters were registered in the last part of the electoral roll during the period.

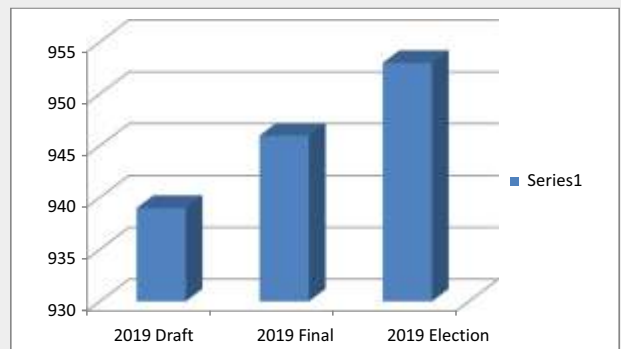
- Youth enrolment in the 18-19 age group increased from 9% to 49% of the projected population
- In terms of numbers, voters in 18-19 age group increased from 1.33 lakh (in draft roll 2019) to 5.45 lakh (in Final Roll 2019) and to 7.81 lakh (during GE 2019).



- E- Roll Gender Ratio improved from 939 to 953 (an increase of 14 points)
- 6,97,387 number of women voters were included in the electoral roll against 5,03,859 male voters during the period Sep 2018-April 2019.

As pre revision activities, rationalization of polling stations was taken up in June-July 2018. There were 35,896 polling stations as on 21.06.2018. During the exercise, after physical verification of polling stations, and consultation/meetings with representatives of recognised political parties the proposals received from DEOs were scrutinised at the level of CEO, Odisha and sent to Commission for approval.

At the end of the rationalisation exercise, as against 35,896 polling stations in the Final Electoral Roll, 2018, 294 polling stations were merged, 2004 polling stations were newly created and the total number of polling stations in the State stood at 37,606. On the date of Draft Publication of rolls on 01.09.2018, each of the polling station had not more than 1400 electors in the draft roll.

Assured Minimum Facilities

Efforts were made to provide basic minimum facilities to voters like drinking water, waiting shed, toilet, electricity (temporary connections wherever permanent electric supply

has not been provided), ramp for the physically challenged voters in all the Polling Stations and standard voting compartments etc.

District wise number of Polling Station along with details of Assured Minimum Facilities and number of Model Polling Stations is given in the table. There were 4111 Polling Stations in network/ communication shadow areas where alternative communication methods like VHF, Runners etc were deployed.

Poll Preparedness Activities

- Chief Electoral Officer issued instructions to all DEOs in July 2018 to take up preparatory works like creation of polling personnel database, vehicle assessment, vulnerability mapping, preparation of District Election Management Plan, tender process for purchase of election materials etc. This was followed up during regular VCs and meetings.
- CEO, Odisha reviewed the preparation of electoral roll and preparatory works in connection with the General Elections division wise at Sambalpur (9.08.2018) Berhampur (25.08.2018), Kendrapara (7.12.2018), Chatrapur (12.12.2018), Jharsuguda (11.12.2018) and Bhubaneswar (13.12.2018).
- Sri Chandra Bhusan Kumar, IAS, Deputy Election Commissioner, Election Commission of India reviewed the preparatory works with all DEOs & Collectors and Superintendent of Police through Video Conferencing on 07.02.2019 prior to the visit of EC to the State

- Election Commission reviewed the preparedness with all CEOs, DGP Odisha, Home Secretary, and all Nodal Officers- Police, Excise and Income Tax on 25.02.2019

PROCUREMENT OF EVMs & VVPATS:

Inter State Transfer of EVMs- A challenge faced successfully by CEO Odisha

Steps taken:

Step-1: Assessment of the requirement of EVMs on the basis of number of polling stations plus reserve as per yardstick of ECI and the nature of Elections; whether single for Lok Sabha only or simultaneous for Lok Sabha and Assembly. Odisha had simultaneous Elections as a regular feature since 2004. After the rationalisation process the number of polling stations was 37606. Accordingly keeping 25% Reserve for both the Elections the number of EVMs were assessed as (37606 X 2)+25% that comes around 92500 BUs and 92500 CUs.

Step-2: ECI's allotment of EVMs from different States. Odisha had been allotted EVMs from 06 (six) other States like Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, Maharashtra, Assam, , Chhatisgarh and Madhya Pradesh as follows:

Step-3: Provision of funds made in budget for allocation as per the requirement projected.

Step-4: Analysis of past election experience and assignment of work of transportation to Container Corporation of India Ltd. having experience and expertise in international as well as domestic freight.

Step-5: Deployment of Nodal Officer for coordination and liaison with the States and CONCOR. UP and West Bengal were the states from which maximum number of EVMs were received; Shri Satrughna Kar, Deputy CEO and Shri Niti Ranjan Sen, Deputy CEO were deputed to office of CEO, UP at Lucknow and office of CEO, West Bengal at Kolkata respectively for pre transfer liaison work with the officials.

Step-6: Preparation of district wise chart for tagging - As per the allotment of ECI EVMs were to be received from 31 districts of UP. Even some districts of Odisha received EVMs from more than one districts of UP and one district of UP transferred EVMs to more than one district of Odisha. As such it required proper planning and execution to lift and shift the EVMs. In the current elections more number of officers (Designated Officers) in the rank of Executive Magistrates along with security personnel from Odisha Armed Police Force had been deputed to the districts of UP and West Bengal.

Step-7: Liaison with CONCOR – Taking into consideration the credibility and efficiency in the domestic freight of goods and services, CONCOR a Maharatna Company of Govt. of India was entrusted to shift EVMs from UP and West Bengal. In the process CONCOR was requested to send the letter of acceptance of the proposal for transportation from CEO, Odisha. Taking into consideration the distance and challenges of shifting EVMs from 31 districts of UP it was decided to shift the EVMs from districts of UP on road in the containers of CONCOR to the depots of CONCOR for transportation on rail rakes to Odisha. Again from the railway depots of CONCOR in Odisha the containers carrying EVMs were transported on road to the destination districts of

Odisha. The letter of acceptance of CONCOR having the terms and conditions of payment were accepted by CEO, Odisha. As a matter of guarantee the amount fixed by CONCOR was deposited in their pre-deposit account (PDA) so that they can access the payment/transaction during the process of transportation of EVMs.

Step-8: Issue of authorisation letter to designated officers for receipt of EVMs from districts of other States. For proper identification of officers receiving the EVMs from the other States letter of authorisation with proper identity card were issued by CEO, Odisha addressed to the DEO of the despatching districts and the respective CEO.

Step-9: Coordination by the designated officers with their counter parts in the districts of other states to know about the preparedness of shifting of EVMs. As per protocol the allotted EVMs by ECI must be entered into ETS and marked ETS out for the destination districts for their lifting. Thereafter the ETS out EVMs are to be stuffed in the EVM boxes and loaded in the CONCOR containers for their eventual shifting to the CONCOR depots in Uttar Pradesh for transportation on rail rakes to Odisha. In case of EVMs from West Bengal the transportation was on road only. However, in either case preparedness of the despatching districts like entry of the unique number of the BU and CU in the ETS is a time consuming process which needs to be confirmed before the transfer. Otherwise the officers from the receiving districts would be unnecessarily stranded

in the outside states. Moreover, the arrangement of local labour for stuffing of the EVMs in the Boxes and loading in the containers of CONCOR was to be ensured in time otherwise the containers of CONCOR if stranded for more than 24 hours would charge heavy demurrage charges.

Step-10: Deputation of Nodal Officers to UP and West Bengal – for proper coordination of the above process and liaison with officers of both states as well as managers of CONCOR, Nodal Officers from the State as mentioned above were deputed to UP and West Bengal respectively. Sri Manoj Kumar Swain, Spl. Officer OMC had accompanied Sri Satrughna Kar, Deputy CEO to UP for better coordination of the shifting of the huge number of EVMs i.e. 54580 BUs and 54840 CUs on rail and road. They worked in tandem with the concerned officials to make the arrangement of lifting and shifting flawlessly. Apart from this in case of shifting of EVMs from UP there was need of coordinating with the officials of Rail Bhawan, Govt. of India. That job was well accomplished by Sri Kar, Deputy CEO by liaising with the senior Officials of the Ministry of Railways, GOI. The EVMs were brought to Odisha in containers in two trains on rail rakes from two depots in UP namely ICT DADRI and ICT AGRA to ICT JHARSUGUDA and ICT BALASORE with proper watch and ward by the Railway Protection Force(RPF) all along the journey till they were handed over to the Designated Officers from the respective districts. The consignment of EVMs reached the state from UP in the record time of less than 36 hours. The sealed containers carrying EVMs were then escorted to their respective EVM godowns under Armed

security cover where the EVMs were received after doing proper ETS entry. The ETS or EVM Tracking Software enables the ECI as well as CEO to know the position of EVMs in different godowns / warehouses of the state. Subsequently the ETS was rechristened as EMS i.e. EVM Management Software.

Sri Niti Ranjan Sen, Deputy Chief Electoral Officer was deputed to West Bengal to coordinate the lifting of EVMs from various districts of the State. The district teams from Odisha went directly to the donor points of West Bengal from where the EVMs were transported by road through the containers / trailer of CONCOR.

As regards the other 4 states having less number of EVMs allotted to Odisha respective District Election officers from Odisha had been assigned to lift and shift the EVMs following the protocols defined by ECI. Officers in the rank of Executive Magistrates with proper security brought the EVMs in hard top and closed bodied trucks. In all cases the ETS 'OUT' and 'IN' of EVMS were ensured.

The interstate transfer of EVMs was by far the greatest challenge in this Simultaneous General Elections considering the strain taken by the senior officers from CEO and State headquarters during last General Elections-2014. As revealed from the Officers working at that time it took them around one and half a month just before the Elections to gather the EVMs from different districts although from one state i.e. Karnataka. It was informed that one single officer had to travel 400 to 600 kms travelling from one district to other and bringing the EVMs to Bengaluru for transportation on rail with the help of CONCOR which was strenuous and cumbersome. But this time due to the meticulous planning by the CEO, Odisha in deploying officers districts wise in advance and Nodal officers from CEO who coordinated and fine-tuned the process,

the EVMs were received in the Districts in record time of less than a fortnight well before the elections to take place. This allowed sufficient time for the District Election officers (DEOs) to carry forward the First Level Checks (FLC) of EVMs and focus on the important statutory works as Elections neared without bothering for the EVMs.

Experience and Suggestions :

However, as experienced this time the transportation of EVMs from Uttar Pradesh was quite challenging; firstly for the more number of Districts to be coordinated and secondly for the timing of transfer. Twenty (20) districts of Odisha had to receive EVMs from as many as 34 different districts of UP. A sample monitoring excel sheet is submitted below for better appreciation.

Mapping was done depending on the proximity of the UP districts to either of the rail side depots of CONCOR like ICT DADRI or ICT AGRA. Officers from Odisha after loading the EVMs meant for their respective districts in the Containers of CONCOR got them sealed by the One Time Openable Locks having unique number. That means the locks cannot be opened en-route before the containers reaching their destinations. The locks can be broke open after the containers arrival in their destination district's EVM ware houses/godowns. The entire exercise warranted maximum effort and huge deployment of officers for safe arrival of EVMs.

Secondly, the timing of shifting of EVMs was not proper as it coincided with the month of "Saawan" when the Kawadias ruled the roads including the National Highways virtually bringing

the traffic of EVM carrying containers to a halt. It required lot of efforts to coordinate with the Law and Order maintaining authorities to make the passage of EVM carrying containers smooth to reach the ICT Depots.

Suggestions: It is suggested that during allotment EVMs by ECI it may be considered to allot from less number of states and the dispatching states may be assigned to have one or two nodal points for lifting of EVMs by the recipient state instead of making such strenuous efforts of gathering EVMs from different districts in which the State Police accompanying the Officers of the receiving states have virtually no power in maintaining the Law and order except being a companion and witness to the event.

Replacement of M2 VVPATs with M2-M3 VVPATs:

Further, M2-M3 VVPATs were used in all ACs & ASs in Odisha, due to larger ratio of FLC rejected VVPATs experienced in the districts of Jajpur, Kalahandi & Sundargarh, where initial allotment was made for M2 VVPATs. Hence, ECI on receipt of the suggestions from CEO, Odisha replaced the entire allotted stock of M2 VVPATs pertaining to districts viz. Jajpur, Kalahandi & Sundargarh for the State of Odisha.

Storage of EVMs and VVPATs:

Challenges in storage of EVMs and VVPATs

With the inclusion of VVPATs, the space requirement in Warehouses / Strong Rooms has increased by almost double. Such kind of floor area is not readily available in many districts. Considering these

constraints, the following suggestions had been made by Odisha which had been approved by Election Commission.

Odisha had suggested for multi layered storage of EVMs and VVPAT. The storage was to be done in steel-racks with the number of layers being limited to three and each layer having a height of 30 inches. The foot of the Steel racks was to be grouted in floor with RCC at least 6 inches to make it strong. This enabled creation of adequate space within the existing warehouse and avoided the requirement of searching for a new warehouse and shifting.

Such a system may not be restricted only to the warehouse but should also be extended to the Strong Rooms keeping the A, B C and D categories of EVMs and VVPATs. In case of Polled EVMs, the same can be kept individually with proper markings.

Timely construction and completion of EVM & VVPAT warehouse:

In Odisha, construction of EVM & VVPAT Warehouse was taken up in all 30 districts of the State. The entire fund for the same was exclusively provided by the State Government against the total budget provision of Rs.1,24,32,40,000/- was made in order to cover construction of all warehouses in the State for storage of EVMs & VVPATs in the entire State of Odisha. All polled EVMs and VVPAT were stored in 26 newly constructed EVM & VVPATs warehouses except four districts viz. Cuttack, Kendrapada, Nuapada&Subarnapur due to non-completion of ancillary infrastructure in the newly constructed district warehouse.

Thus, timely completion of the Warehouses could provide storage of the EVMs & VVPATs under strict, uniform, high profile administrative and physical security as per legal framework across the entire State of Odisha.

First level checking of EVMs & VVPATs:

Long process of FLC period conducted in several phases due to allotment of inadequate nos. of VVPATs: FLC period for the Simultaneous General Election, 2019 started for the State of Odisha on 03.09.2018. The period of FLC got further elongated due to non-availability of adequate nos. of VVPATs for which, M-2 VVPATs were loaned from Kalahandi&Jajpur district to start up with the FLC of EVMs & VVPATs for 28 districts on 31.10.2018 and for this avoidable inconvenience was caused due to returning back of those loaned machines (including those defective machines after use by the borrower districts) from the borrowed districts. It is pertinent to mention that the First phase of Simultaneous Elections, 2019 for Odisha started w.e.f. 11.04.2019. Thus there is a gap of 208 days, say approximately 07 -months against the ECI instruction for commencement of FLC at least P-120 for General Election for State legislative Assembly and at least P-180 days for General Elections to Lok Sabha. Such delay had a resultant effect on loss of precious man-days, human energy and avoidable expenditure incurred on account of deployment of ECIL engineers.

100% use of VVPATs in ACs & ASs:

The unique experience is that Odisha for the first time used 100% VVPATs in the Simultaneous General Elections, 2019 in its 147 Assembly Constituencies and in 21 Parliamentary Constituencies as per the instructions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the ECI had introduced the technology of VVPAT in order to ensure public examinability. Thus the commitment of ECI to implement VVPATs nationwide by 2019 was attained in 100% voter verifiability and auditability of every vote cast by the citizens. The confidence of various apex courts to brand EVMs & VVPATs as “national pride” could be reposed in our State in particular and all throughout the country in general.

Demonstration & training awareness:

While awareness with regards to EVMs is fairly good now, since VVPATs were being used for the first time, awareness of all stakeholders – the Candidates and Political parties, the Voters and the Election Related Officials was a big challenge before the elections. As a new equipment attached to EVMs, and with political parties ever willing to raise aspersions on the EVM system, it was absolutely necessary to educate the voters, political parties and the polling officials about the VVPAT machines. To achieve this the following interventions were made which helped tremendously:

- (i) In response to the proposal of CEO, Odisha for Demonstration & Awareness Programme vide this Department Letter No. 239/CEO dated 05.12.2019, ECI had approved the proposal vide its Letter No. 51/8/T & A /2019-EMPS dated 22.01.2019 and had communicated for its implementation by all CEOs of the States & Union Territories as a demonstration and awareness model. A detailed Standard Operating protocol and Guidelines were prepared centrally by CEO Office for undertaking this massive exercise (given in the Annexure) The guidelines were all encompassing including there-in the security protocols to be followed during any movement and awareness of EVMs and VVPATs, the daily movement, number of PS/ villages to be covered each day, the protocols to be followed by the Demonstration team, safe storage each day, cost structure etc.

(ii) Such guideline ensures clear understanding and clarity in roles and responsibilities of each stakeholder in the awareness and training team. A document had been designed to capture details of votes casted in order to keep accountability of each demo team.

(iii) Two rounds of such awareness drive were undertaken where-in all the villages of the State were covered. In the first round approximately 30 lakh voters participated and in the second round approximately 48 lakh voters participated. The success of the effort could be gauged from the fact that during the entire 4 phases of elections, there was no complaint of people not knowing about this new machine VVPAT. There was not one news either in print or electronic medium where it was indicated that people were unaware of the Voting process and machines.

(iv) Bi-weekly monitoring was done by capturing the movement and coverage using a Google Document. Each RO was to update the data twice every week at their level. Their emails were mapped to the google document and they could easily update their progress. The same was visible in real-time to CEO office and proved very helpful in monitoring and taking corrective measures wherever required. For this purpose, EVMs and VVPATs had been taken out for training and awareness purpose whenever needed even before first randomization subject to an upper ceiling of 10% of the total number of Polling Stations in the District.

First randomization:

EVMs & VVPATs were randomized using EVM Management System (EMS). Only FLC approved EVMs as per EMS get picked up for first randomisation. This is done after FLC in order to allocate EVMs available in district, randomly, to



particular AC in presence of representatives of political parties.

Second randomization & commissioning of EVMs & VVPATs;

This is done just before 'candidate setting' in order to allocate EVMs available in an AC to Specific Polling stations in presence of candidates/ election agents. The details of the commissioning of the EVMs & VVPATs in four different phases of the elections are given in the Annexure.

Besides usual process of settlement of conflicts of EVMs & VVPATs from time to time, a mega drive was taken by ECI on 14.09.2018 to settle BEL Make BUs, CUs & VVPATs, which has been long pending since 2014 Simultaneous General Elections are as follows; with Karnataka, Gujarat & Odisha. POLL DAY MANAGEMENT:

Re-scheduling of time for conduct of mock poll on poll day:

For the first time, taking into account the suggestions given by CEO, Odisha and other CEOs, ECI had directed that Mock Poll shall be started 90 minutes (one & half hour) before the commencement of the Actual Poll in all Polling Stations where Simultaneous General Election & Bye-elections are to be held.

Experience:

A very serious and unprecedented situation occurred during the second and third phase of

elections in Odisha – The Cross Pairing of EVMs and VVPATs. Since Odisha was having simultaneous elections, two sets of EVMs and VVPATs were being used in every Polling Station. Generally, at the time of commencement of Poll on the Pol Day, the pairing and connection of machines (EVMs with VVPATs) was done correctly. However, it was noticed that in case of any failure of either the VVPAT, where as per the directions of Commission, only the VVPAT is to be changed, the Cross-Pairing happened. To put it simply, suppose if the VVPAT meant for Assembly Segment of the PC was reported to be defective and required to be changed, when the Sector Officer in-charge of the reserve EVMs and VVPATs came for replacing the defective VVPAT, he replaced the Assembly Segment VVPAT with the Assembly Constituency VVPAT. As a result, when a voter pressed the button of candidate of his choice, his vote was printed by the VVPAT to another candidate. Since the AC VVPAT had been paired wrongly with AS EVMs, this was bound to happen and had an unwarranted serious adverse impact on the credibility of the electoral process. This was purely human error, sheer negligence on the part of the Sector Officer and the Presiding Officer. All Officials responsible for such lapse have been placed under suspension and are being proceeded against.

Timely intervention:

On the day this incident occurred (during polling in second phase on 18.04.2019), at around 2.30 PM, a panel discussion in local vernacular channels had just begun questioning the efficacy and effectiveness of voting machines with special focus on the traditional complaint of votes being reflected incorrectly by the VVPAT machines. Such a discussion was bound to adversely effect the entire electoral process across the State and the Country and could have triggered an unwarranted discussion on the credibility of EVMs. Within 5 to 10 minutes, a Press Conference was convened by the CEO and the issue/ human error committed by few negligent officials was explained to the general public by going LIVE on TV. Media persons were also briefed appropriately, all their queries answered to their satisfaction which ensured that **timely intervention, transparency and adequate and correct information are key to solving any crisis of such a magnitude.**

Use of mobile based vehicle tracking system:

The Sector Magistrates carry the Reserve EVMs & VVPATs with them on Poll day for replacement of defective EVMs / VVPATs in Polling Station during Mock Poll / Actual Poll. As the Sector Officers are moving from one Polling

Station to other during Poll, safeguarding the EVMs & VVPATs is a challenging task. In order to safeguard the EVMs / VVPATs on transit, during Simultaneous General Elections-2019, the Chief Electoral Officer, Odisha implemented a real time mobile-based location and movement tracking application to track the movement of Sector Magistrates (carrying reserve EVMs / VVPATs).

The system was implemented successfully in all districts during Poll. Total 4361 vehicles were tracked in 4 phases of Poll. Benefits of the system are real time tracking, easy implementation, no exclusive GPS device is required, and is cost-effective too.

Launching of EVM Management Scheme (EMS) wef 20.02.2019.

The use of EVMs in the election process has been one of the radical transformations of the election process in recent times. Given the large number of EVMs in the States / UTs, the need of an application for their management and tracking was felt.

The erstwhile system i.e. EVM Tracking System (ETS) has served its useful life and a new system conforming to the contemporary concepts related to usability, reliability, scalability and cyber security has to be developed.



Commissioning of EVMs- Balasore

Apart from enabling management of EVMs inventory, the system permits tracking of the EVMs from the date of its introduction to the time it is destroyed after its useful life. The EMS application automates the election activities concerning EVMs like FLC, Randomization (First and Second), Marking and Unmarking EP and receiving back units in system after counting.

The EVM Management System has two components; a Web-based application and a Mobile application. The Web-Based application with core functions related to EVM business process and will be used by user such as manufacturer, ECI, CEOs, DEOs, Warehouse In-charge etc. Role based access will be provided to different users at same URL, Mobile Application is a supporting application, which will be used by temporary users for mainly scanning at warehouse level during sending and receiving EVM Units, FLC, receiving in AC after 1st randomization, etc.

Odisha had got the real time opportunity to successfully implement the EMS project in the maiden launch of the system during the Simultaneous General Election, 2019 in its four different phases of elections.

Conclusion:

Role of ECI & M/S ECIL Ltd.: Timely guidance, cooperation & coordination especially with the

authorities of EVM & VVPAT Division & EMS Division of ECI and the Officers of M/S ECIL Ltd. Hyderabad & Kolkata Division could facilitate immensely in successful and flawless conduct of Simultaneous Elections, undertaken by the Office of the CEO, Odisha.

Wider utilisation of ECI/CEO, Odisha Website, Whatsapp, Use of Google Tools in the electoral process (Google Doc, Google forms, Google Sheet)

In the past, during the conduct of elections, information was collected from the field level through Special Messenger, FAX, letter correspondence, e-mail etc. which takes lot of time. Precious man hours are spent in contacting and collecting and compiling information from field level by the office of CEO. This not only consumes time but also engages the resources in carrying out futile exercise.

In order to utilize the resources to their potential, save time and real time monitoring of activities, office of CEO adapted using powerful tools of Google i.e. Google Doc, Google sheets, and Google Forms to collect the data in a secured manner from the field. This has helped in almost avoiding the manual process of compiling information for monitoring the activities at field level

Training and Capacity Building

Election Management is one of the essential task for conducting smooth, fair and transparent election, which require capacity building of the officers involved in the process. As the transparency factor during General Elections is under challenge in different forums in recent years, the task of election management process has increased manifold. In order to overcome such challenges, proper orientation and training of election functionaries becomes extremely vital and Election Commission of India has laid great emphasis on this aspect.



State level Training of DLMTS

State Level Master Trainers: In order to achieve the goal and to accomplish the objective, all-out effort has been given to impart training to all State Level functionaries and District Level functionaries including the polling personnel. In the first phase, 44 numbers of Administrative Officers and Technical Officers were imparted training as State Level Master Trainer (SLMT) at India International Institute for Election Management (IIIDEM), New Delhi during the months of September & October, 2018.

District Level Master Trainers: The State Level Master Trainer (SLMT) were entrusted with imparting a two days training to District Level Master Trainer (DLMT) scheduled at different State Level Training Institutes like Gopabandhu Academy of Administration (GAA), State Institute for Rural Development (SIRD), Institute on Management of Agricultural Extension (IMAGE) and Odisha University of Agriculture & Technology (OUAT) at Bhubaneswar. A total number of 1136 DLMTs were imparted training at the State Level during September & October, 2018 in the first phase. Each training group had 50 trainees and on each day, five to six classes on different subjects were scheduled.

Audios and Videos of different election procedures, handling of EVM/VVPAT, etc. as well as materials for educating the general voters through SVEEP were prepared and provided to the trainees for updating their knowledge on the activities to be performed during election process. Besides, updated materials in form of PPT, hard copy/soft copy of latest instructions of ECI and printed materials like important handbooks of the ECI were provided to the trainees for their reference.

Further, as per the revised calendar of ECI, New Delhi, 76 numbers of Administrative Officers and Technical Officers were further undergone training as State Level Master Trainer (SLMT) as per the new schedule during the month of November, December & January, 2019 in the second

phase. Accordingly, another two days training programme for 1209 District Level Master Trainers (DLMT) was conducted during the month of November, December & January, 2019 in the second phase.

Special emphasis was given on Hands-on training on EVM/VVPAT including the process of tagging and sealing. All the DLMTs were instructed to go through the manual on handling of EVM/VVPAT and FAQs provided to them for successful disposal of the mechanical errors if found in the machines. After the end of each training session, evaluation test with 80% marks for qualifying was conducted in order to assess the involvement of the DLMTs in the training programme.

Training to DEOs/ ROs and AROs: Special four days training for RO/ARO for Assembly Constituencies/Deputy Collector (Election) and two days training for DEO-cum-Collector and RO for Parliamentary Constituencies were also conducted during February- March 2019. Rigorous Hands-on training on EVM/VVPAT was also conducted for these officers also. During that training focus was

also given on the topics like roles and responsibilities of DEO & RO on matters relating to:

1. Electoral Roll, Continuous updation, District Election Management Plan, Booth level plan
2. Qualification and Disqualification, Scrutiny, withdrawal and allotment of symbols, Model Code of Conduct

issues in the office of Chief Electoral Officer on 5th February 2019. Cascaded Training of Police Officers like SDPOs and Inspectors were conducted at district level from 6th February, 2019 to 23rd February, 2019. Trained SLMTs were assigned to train these Police Officers. Besides, one day training of Senior Police Officers was conducted at 3 Zonal Headquarters i.e at Sambalpur & Bhubaneswar on 30.01.2019 & at Berhampur on 31.01.2019. The topics of the training was-

1. Role & Responsibilities of Police Officers
2. Vulnerability Mapping, Identification of Critical Polling Stations
3. Model Code of Conduct
4. Election Expenditure Monitoring – Role of Police Officers
5. Police Communication Plan, Police Deployment Plan
6. C-Vigil and IT application for Daily Reporting Systems.

Polling Personnel: A total number of 225636 Polling personnel including Presiding Officers and First Polling Officers was conducted during February and March, 2019. While two rounds of training was given to Presiding Officers and 1st Polling Officers, all the polling personnel were given training in the 3rd and last round. A one day Training of 3822 numbers of

Sector Officers was conducted in all the districts with a dedicated session on Hands-On EVM/VVPAT. Besides, half a day Training of 37606 numbers of Booth Level Officers was also conducted in all the 30 Districts. A total number of 2669 teams of MCC & EEM were given training at District Level by the end of February 2019.

Counting Training: A two days' Orientation-cum-Training programme for ROs/AROs and DEO-cum-Collectors on Counting of Votes was conducted at Geeta Govinda Sadan, Bhubaneswar on 13th and 14th of May, 2019. A total number of 102 numbers of RO/ARO and Collectors underwent training during the Orientation-cum-Training programme. Extensive Hands-on training on Counting was provided to all ROs/AROs and Collectors under the direct supervision of the CEO, Odisha. 20 SLMTs and three NLMTs were engaged to impart training during these Two Days' Orientation-cum-Training programme. Senior Consultant of Election Commission of India Mr. Bhanwar Lal attended the counting training as Observer. Besides, a total number of 5072 Counting Personnel all over the State for 147 Counting Halls were imparted training under direct supervision of ROs/AROs at concerned district headquarters.

Best Practices/Interventions:

- The number of trainees per batch was limited to a maximum of 40-45 persons in all the cascaded trainings.
- Emphasis was given on EVM- VVPAT hands on
- Module on Accessible Elections was a part of each training.
- All the election officers were trained on Postal Ballot paper.

Material Management

One of the most important pre-election challenge in material management is printing of 45 number of statutory forms/covers & 83 No. of non-statutory forms, covers and signboards which in total numbers around 15 crore & printing of around 6 lakh Handbooks, Compendium of Instructions, and booklets for election within a limited time frame. The preparatory activity for the above work were taken up nine months in advance and printing and distribution of form, cover, signboard and handbooks etc. was completed in between November 2018 to March 2019 except ballot paper and postal ballot paper.

The new and amended forms received from the Commission were translated into Odia at Odisha Bhasa Pratisthan, Bhubaneswar and vetted by Law Department before printing of the same was taken up.

Printing of forms

There were different types of forms, covers, registers, handbooks and compendiums which were to be printed for use by Presiding Officer, Returning Officer and for other election purpose. The following table indicates the abstract of forms printed for Presiding Officer, Returning Officer, District Election Officer and for conduct of election.

Printing of Handbooks, Compendiums of Instructions, Manuals etc.

Procurement of election materials

Procurement of election materials for use by Returning Officer was made as per agencies specified by Election Commission. Procurement of voting compartment was made by floating of centralized tender and the supplier and rate was finalized by CEO and the districts were given the option to place order with this firm subject to their satisfaction regarding timely supply of required number of voting compartments by the firm.

The following materials were procured for Conduct of Simultaneous General Election 2019 from the agencies as indicated below.

Compilation and translation of Handbooks

The following books were translated into Odia though Odisha Bhasa Pratishtan & printed at Directorate of Printing Stationery & Publications, Odisha, Cuttack.

The Godown in the premises of Directorate of Census, Unit 9, Bhubaneswar was requisitioned by CEO, Odisha u/s 160 of the Representation of Peoples Act, 1951. The forms, covers, booklets etc. printed at Government Press, Cuttack and Bhubaneswar were lifted from the Press and shifted to the Census godown, Bhubaneswar for distribution to the districts. Commissionerate of Police, Bhubaneswar posted adequate police personnel to guard the election stationeries.

the Returning Officers/ districts was supervised by one Under Secretary. The scale of distribution of various election stationeries is given in the Annexure. Teams of officers / staff were deployed to the Govt Press, Cuttack and the Census godown for distribution of all the materials.

The various types of paper seals, special tags, power packs for CU and VVPAT and indelible ink were distributed from the election godown at the CEOs office/ Census godown.

The Voting Compartments were supplied through a single vendor selected through a competitive tender process. At Rs. 193/- per voting compartment (24" x 24" x 30") excluding GST, it was one of the lowest rates in the country. The rate of the bigger voting

compartment (24" x 36" x 30") was Rs. 211/- per compartment excluding GST. The supplier delivered the voting compartments in March 2019 at 5 hub districts, and all other districts were asked to lift the same from the hub district.

Printing of EVM and tendered Ballot Papers

The printing of EVM and tendered ballot papers was taken up at Government Press, Cuttack. For the purpose of ballot papers for the Ballot Units, the papers were printed at the rate of one per Polling Station with additional 35% reserve. Further, for the purpose of tendered ballot paper, 20 ballot papers per polling station and additional 15% reserve were printed and supplied to the Returning Officers. A

total of 18.31 Lakh ballot papers for 21 PCs and 147 Assembly Constituencies were printed.

The printing of ballot papers was supervised by one Joint Chief Electoral Officer, and dedicated teams of officers and staff were deployed at the Govt Press, Cuttack for verifying the correctness of form 7A, approving the sample ballot papers, printing and distribution to the authorized officers deputed by

the District Election Officer. In view of the severe heat wave, air-conditioners were installed at the Liaison Office set up at Government Press, Cuttack.

Printing of Braille Dummy Sheets

During GE 2014, Braille Dummy Sheets were supplied only to a few polling stations at Berhampur and Bhubaneswar for facilitation of visually impaired voters. For the first time, 42,200 Braille

Dummy Sheets were printed at Red Cross Computerised Braille Press, Berhampur. Such dummy sheets were supplied to 21,100 Polling stations where visually impaired voters had been flagged in the Electoral Roll.

One Nodal Officer nominated by DEO & Collector, Ganjam supervised the proof reading and printing of the dummy sheets and their lifting by the DSSOs

cum district Nodal Officers for this purpose. Proof readers nominated by the SSEPD department were deputed from Bhubaneswar besides the proof readers available at Berhampur. Staff from Government Press, Cuttack were requisitioned for sorting, stamping, sealing etc of the dummy sheets.

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Chapter - IX



Logistics Management

Polling Personnel

Government/PSU employees are deployed at polling stations on Polling day for conduct of Election. To ensure free and fair conduct of election, employees are drafted and deployed at polling stations using three stage randomisation process as specified by Election Commission of India (ECI). Polling Personnel Randomisation software developed by National Informatics Centre, Bhubaneswar was implemented to draft and deploy Government/PSU employees at each polling station. The Customizable Software could be used both in standalone and online mode and had easy to use user interface.

The Randomisation software had the following features:

- a. Capturing employee data in the system
- b. Validation and assigning role to each employee (Presiding Officer, Polling Officers, Micro-Observer etc.
- c. Draft 120% employees from the employee pool as per guidelines of ECI.
- d. Formation of polling groups and assigning Assembly Constituencies as per the guidelines of ECI
- e. Assigning polling stations to polling groups as per the guidelines of ECI
- f. Generate Form 12 by fetching Electoral Roll data
- g. Generate identity cards for the polling personnel.
- h. Generate different reports in the prescribed format of ECI (appointment order, training schedule and attendance, stage wise MIS reports, other abstract reports)

Female employees were also included as polling personnel. They were deployed at polling stations located in Urban areas and within 10 KM from the Urban location. In one polling station, maximum 2-3 female polling personnel were deployed. In addition to this, few Model polling stations were identified in every district where all polling personnel were females.

The software was implemented in all 30 districts of Odisha with due approval from CEO, Odisha. The randomisation processes were executed in the presence of DEO, Election Observer and video-graphed.

In view of the fact that some districts like Deogarh, Malkangiri, Gajapati, Nuapada, Jharsuguda, Sonapur had only one or two Assembly Constituencies and adequate number of polling

personnel satisfying the criteria (not residing or working in the AC/not a voter or native of the AC etc) as fixed by Election Commission were not available, Commission allowed relaxation of the criteria.

District Level Nodal Officers

Besides, Nodal Officers per district relating to Manpower Management, EVM Management, Transport, Training, Material Management, MCC, Expenditure Monitoring, Observer, Law and Order, Vulnerability Mapping and district security plan, Ballot Paper, Media / Communication, Computerization, SVEEP, Helpline and complaints-redressal, C-Vigil and Communication Plan were appointed for monitoring the various election processes and ensure timely compliance within given time frames.

In addition, Chief Electoral Officer, Odisha held video conferencing with DEOs, ROs, Nodal Officers, IT staff etc. every Friday after poll announcement to

keep them updated on recent instructions and guidelines of the Commission, review election preparedness, sort out difficulties & problems and clarify doubts.

Transportation

The DEOs were instructed to assess the requirement of vehicles as an exercise for preparation of District Election Management Plan right from July 2018. Sri Manoranjan Mishra, Principal DTS cum Jt. Commissioner was deployed as Nodal Officer in the CEO office to co-ordinate the requisitioning of vehicles. Certain districts like Malkangiri, Kalahandietc reported that sufficient number of large vehicles were not available within the district. All Revenue Divisional Commissioners were made Nodal Officers to co-ordinate the deployment of vehicles from surplus districts to districts having a requirement of certain categories of vehicles.

The rates of compensation/ hire charges of different categories of vehicles was notified vide Extra Ordinary Gazette No. 7540 dated 10.09.2018, No. 3990 dated 7.03.2019 & No. 8508 dated 12.04.2019 as given below.

Webcasting / CCTV/ Videography / Still Cameras

As non- CAPF measures to cover sensitive polling stations, webcasting / CCTV/ Videography and still photography arrangements were made.

Commission's instructions were to cover at least 10% of polling stations through web-casting. Since some districts had difficulty in identifying suitable vendors for installing web casting facilities at the polling stations, and there was a huge variation in the rates quoted by different firms in the various districts, a central tender was floated by the



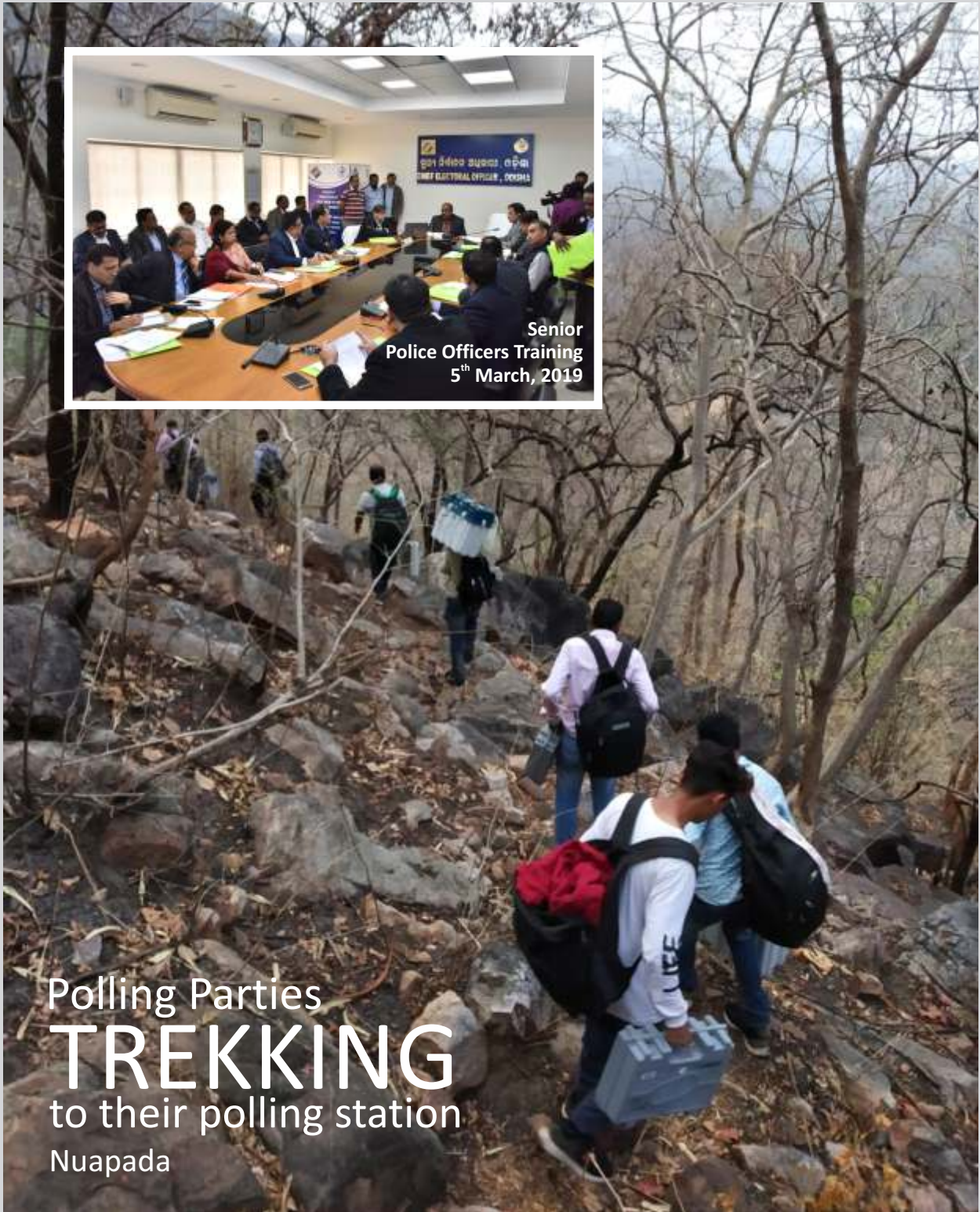
office of CEO, Odisha. M/s. V Mukti Solutions Pvt Ltd, 3,4, Shivalika Plaza, Near Sahajanand College, IIM Road, Ambawadi, Ahmedabad was selected as the firm for installing web-casting at the polling station. The lowest rate quoted and finalized was Rs. 6900/- (for polling day for each polling station) and Rs. 8500/- for counting day.

Arrangements for CCTV, videography and still photography were made locally by the DEOs and Collectors. Out of the 37606 polling stations, webcasting was installed in 3601 polling stations, CCTV in 2306, Micro- Observers were deployed in 2763 polling stations, videography was done in 1240 and still photography in 897 polling stations.

The district wise deployment of the above non-CAPF measures in sensitive / vulnerable polling stations is given in the Annexure.

Security Management

1. Pre-Poll preparedness – Vulnerability mapping and assessment of sensitivity of the different polling stations of the State :

District wise review of the Vulnerability mapping, critical polling stations were done well ahead of the elections by conducting Video Conferences fortnightly and Zonal Conferences of District Election Officers prior to the Polls personally by the Chief Electoral Officer.

There were regular meetings with State level Nodal Officers like Police (Law & Order), IG CRPF-cum- Force Coordinator Odisha, IG BSF Odisha by CEO, Odisha to chalk out detailed force deployment plan.

2. Force Deployment –During the last General Elections- 2014, a total of 171 companies of forces were deployed out of which 60 companies were deployed from outside of State. During GE 2019,

based on assessment, 150 Companies of CAPF was requested to ensure smooth conduct of polls. Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, New Delhi allotted 133 Coys of CAPF for peaceful conduct of the poll in the State.

The poll was conducted in 4 phases simultaneously for the Lok Sabha and Odisha Legislative Assembly. Accordingly the Force (CAPF) were deployed in phases as per the following strength.

- First Phase-Poll on 11.04.2019 – 114 Coys
- Second Phase-Poll on 18.04.2019 – 59 Coys
- Third Phase-Poll on 23.04.2019 – 52 Coys
- Fourth Phase-Poll on 29.04.2019 – 44 Coys

(For 96- Patakura Assembly Constituency the contesting candidate from BJD Shri Bed Prakash Agarwalla died after the publication of list of contesting candidates in form-7A and before

conduct of polls. As such, although the Lok Sabha Elections for 96-Patkura Assembly Segment of 15-Kendrapara PC was held on the due date of poll ie-29.04.2019 but the polls for the Assembly Constituency was initially adjourned to 19th May, 2019. Subsequently due to the devastation caused by the Super Cyclonic Storm FANI which swept the coastal districts of Odisha including the District of Kendrapara on 3rd of May,2019 the poll was further adjourned to 20th July 2019 as per Commission's Order. The scale of deployment is indicated below:

State Armed Police personnel from neighbouring States like Telengana (02 COYs) and Andhra Pradesh (07 COYS) had also been deployed for effective maintenance of Security and Law and Order.

Besides this, non-CAPF force multiplier measures like web casting, CCTV Surveillance, deployment of Micro Observers etc. were done in the sensitive polling stations to keep an eye on any type of electoral malpractices and incidence of untoward law and order issues on poll day . In such circumstances, the concerned law and order maintaining authorities were alerted to take necessary preventive action in course of the poll.

De-induction of Forces: After completion of the different phases of poll the Forces were de-inducted and 35 Companies of CAPFs were retained for guarding the polled EVM strong rooms and for

3. Deployment of Helicopters/ Air Ambulance:

The ECI had made provisions for four helicopters to be commissioned in the multi-phased elections in the State of Odisha. As per the requirement projected by the DEOs of Malkangiri, Koraput & Nuapada that went for polls in the First Phase, two helicopters were deployed for transportation of EVMs, safe lifting/transportation of the polling parties and casualty evacuation: one at Malkangiri for Chittrakonda AC and the other at Nuapada for Nuapada AC and Khariar AC having LWE threats. In this process, 72 polling personnel of Malkangiri Districts were Air lifted from Khunturpadar BSF camp (IRBn) for smooth conduct of polls in the nine polling stations of the Swabhiman Anchal area of Chittrakonda AC. In case of Nuapada district, taking into the ground situations and threat perception,

56 polling personnel of 07 polling parties were safely transported on alternate routes to the destined polling stations & back although the helicopters of IAF was stationed in the base camp at Gautama Air Strip of Nuapada. Mr. J V S Guron Air Comdr from IAF Raipur (C.G.) base was in charge of commanding the sorties.

As there was no Air Ambulance in the State, Commission had been requested to provide the same for meeting requirements of Air lifting the Polling Parties / Security Personnel deployed in Election duty in case of any eventuality. Accordingly, the Indian Air Force had kept one Air Ambulance in readiness at the Raipur Air Base (Chhatisgarh) that was nearest to the Area of Operation. Indian Oil Corporation (IOCL) had been entrusted to provide refueling facilities at Malkangiri and Nuapada which they complied with utmost care and sincerity.

SECURITY ARRANGEMENTS FOR POLLED EVM STRONG ROOMS & COUNTING CENTERS:

There were 63 counting centers in the State for 147 ACs and ASs where the polled EVM Strong Rooms have been setup. Accordingly forces were deployed as per the yard stick of the Commission for safety and security of the polled EVMs. Each counting center/ EVM strong room was guarded by 1 platoon of CAPF. All the strong rooms were equipped with 24X7 CCTV surveillance and power back up by dual inverters and computer systems for data backup.

Incidence of Super Cyclonic Storm “FANI” on 3rd May, 2019 and preventive measures taken:

Taking regular feedback from the forecasts of Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) regarding the occurrence of the Super Cyclonic Storm “FANI” all the District Election Officers and Returning Officers had been alerted to take preventive measures so that the EVMs and VVPATs are not damaged by the rain and storm which was likely to hit 17 of the 30 districts of the State. Emergency shifting of polled EVMs were occasioned in districts like Gajapati and Jagatsinghpur for better safety of the EVMs. In many districts retrofitting measures for

rain proofing, strong proofing constructions were taken up with due approval of the Commission in the Polled EVM strong rooms. Senior officers from the office of CEO were deputed to FANI affected districts to review the security and safety of the polled EVMs.

Daily reporting on Law & Order Situation: CEO, Odisha in association with the National Informatics Centre (NIC) State Headquarters, Bhubaneswar had developed the Law & Order portal for online collection of reports from the 34 police districts and two Government Railway Police divisions for reporting on various parameters like seizure of unlicensed arms / explosives, raid on illicit arms manufacturing centres, deposit / impounding / cancellation of licensed arms, number of persons bound down under section 107 and 116 of CRPC etc., execution of NBWs, number of incidents of violence related to poll campaign, political rivalry besides detail reporting on such violent incidents district wise. The same reports were collected online by the State Nodal Officer of Police (Law & Order) and submitted the CEO, Odisha for onward transmission to ECI with his comments. This online portal proved to be of immense help in real time reporting of incidents to the Commission. As

expected by the Commission the LOR – I and LOR-II reports are to be submitted daily covering the incidents from the previous day 6.00 AM to the reporting day **6.00 AM**. Online collection of such reports saved lot of precious time in collecting and collating the reports from the 36 destinations.

The Kandhamal Incidents & Experience:

On 16th of April 2019, most of the polling parties left for their respective polling Stations from the dispersal centre except few due to intelligence input regarding planning of Maoist activities to attack the polling party. Polling party for Mingunpadar Polling Station No.30 of 84- Phulbani AC. was also among the few who left the dispersal centre on 17th April morning. But the polling party faced land mine explosion triggered by armed Maoist on their way to Mingunpadar. Fortunately, both the vehicles escaped from the land mine and stopped on the spot. Suddenly armed Maoist came out and asked all the polling parties to get down from the vehicles. The ultras then torched both the vehicles and a bike of the BLO including the EVMs & VVPATs. The Ultras instructed the polling party members to return back and not to come back to the polling station for polling. The polling party returned back to the dispersal centre.

The District Administration with the help of Police Administration and support of Para Military Forces prepared an action plan to conduct poll and a substitute polling party for the booth No.30 Mingunpadar. It took several hours to convince the new polling party to start their journey with dedicated team of Para Military Forces. They started their journey by foot to the polling station and successfully conducted poll on 18th of April 2019 and returned back to the receiving centre by foot amidst security cordon of para -military forces.

In another instance on the same day i.e 17th April 2019 (the day before the poll day) in another Maoist dominated area near Polling Station No.12 namely Barahala, armed Maoists once again triggered land mine explosion. The vehicle carrying supporting election machineries escaped and tried to return back from the spot and suddenly the Maoists fired on the vehicle. A woman employee namely Smt. Sanjukta Digal, Grama Rojogar Sevak who was on election duty was shot dead during the above gun firing by Ultras.

The Maoists made several attempts to attack on polling parties on their way back to the receiving centre by cutting down trees to block the road. But due to timely intelligence inputs and counter

planning by Para Military Forces, all the polling parties safely reached the receiving centres amidst the tight security cordon of Para military Forces.

The DEO & Collector, Kandhamal felicitated the members of the polling party namely Sri Bidhan Chandra Jena, Asst. Teacher (Presiding Officer), Sri Laxmikant Mallick, Asst. Teacher, (1st Polling Officer), Sri Nepolian Sahoo, Asst. Teacher (2nd Polling Officer), Sri Kaniska Pradhan, Sikhya Sahayak (3rd Polling Officer), Sri Ashutosh Nayak, Asst. Teacher (4th Polling Officer) and Sri Radhakant Patra, Peon, (5th Polling Officer) for their motivation and dedication.

The Malkangiri Experience - A Walk to Remember

The Backdrop: It was a tough challenge to conduct safe elections in Malkangiri with active movement of Armed LWE Cadres. During the Simultaneous General Elections-2014, 15 cases of EVM snatching

had been reported. This time also, threats were issued by Naxals for boycotting the General Elections. Detailed preparations were made with a 3 tier arrival plan of Polling Parties in their respective Polling Stations with intermediate halts.

On the eve of Polling day, i.e. on the evening of 10.04.2019, credible intelligence inputs were received that LWE cadres had arrived in Mudulipada and Bonda Ghati area with a plan to disrupt the elections, rather than their conventional focus and dominated areas of Tulsipahad in Mathili block and Swabhiman Anchala (cut-off area) under Chitrakonda block. Thus, the entire focus was now shifted to Khairput Block and Bonda Ghati.

The nine booths of Swabhiman Anchala designated as extremely vulnerable from security point of view could not be reached by launch boats due to threat perceptions. The Polling parties were

airlifted and dropped at Kunturpadar. After conducting the polls, they were again sent back to Malkangiri town.

A Walk To Remember: The movement plan was tweaked to suit the immediate needs and was based on the inputs of the Police, the BSF and the intelligence. Another immediate additional plan was to prepare designated places for storing of reserve EVMs for replacement in case of failures on the day of elections.

To evolve a counter strategy to the possible disruption of Malkangiri elections, the Collector and the SP made a joint visit to Govindpali intermediate halt to meet the teams and brief them and accordingly an emergency plan was made to safely rescue the teams and EVMs after conducting poll, the next day. But it was surprisingly found that all members were willing to take this risk.

From the wee hours of the 11th April (the poll day) to the morning of the 12th April, bike runners were the eyes and ears of the

administration for these polling stations and played an important role in the successful return of the polling parties. After persuasion by the Sector Officer Sri Behera, WEO and intermittent conversation with the local BDO over phone the polling party members, after the poll, decided to join the motivated few in a walk to remember.

After conducting the poll successfully from 5 PM to 10 PM the polling parties walked undauntedly through the treacherous, undulating mountain slopes fully interspersed with granite boulders and took rest during the night under the watchful eyes of the security personnel. At 5 AM they resumed their unfinished journey. One young Presiding Officer with sore groin but sporting occasional smile couldn't hide his excitement while expressing how completing the 15 km walk in the hills was the most memorable experience of his life. *It was a walk to remember.* The men had displayed great courage in adversity to be a part of the largest democratic exercise.

Returning Officers and Asst. Returning Officers for Parliament Constituencies

For the 21 Parliamentary Constituencies, DEOs & Collectors have been notified as Returning Officer in 20 Parliamentary Constituencies and the PD, DRDA, Ganjam has been notified as Returning Officer of 20-Berhampur PC vide Gazette Notification No.434 / OR-HP / 2008 (I) dated 13.06.2008 and amended on 22.01.2009.

Senior Officers of the district like Additional District Magistrate, Sub-Collector, Addl. Sub-Collector have been notified as Assistant Returning Officer of Parliamentary Constituencies vide Gazette Notification No. No.434 / OR-HP / 2008 (2) dated 13.06.2008 and amended on 22.01.2009.

Returning Officers and Asst. Returning Officers for Assembly Constituencies

Sub-Collectors of 58 Sub-Divisions have been notified as Returning Officers for Assembly Constituencies subject to a maximum of 2 Assembly Constituencies per Returning Officer. ADMs and Addl. Sub-Collectors have been notified as Returning Officers for the remaining Assembly Constituencies vide Gazette Notification No.No.434 / OR-LA / 2008 (I) dated 13.06.2008 and amended on 22.01.2009. There are a total of 92 Officers notified as Returning Officers for 147 Assembly Constituencies in the State.

Revenue Officers like Tahsildars, Block Development Officers and Addl. Tahsildars have been notified as Asst. Returning Officers for Assembly Constituencies vide Gazette Notification No. 434/ OR –LA/ 2013 (2) dated 16.09.2013. There are 294 notified Assistant Returning Officers for 147 Assembly Constituencies in the State. All the above notifications have been put up in CEO's website.

Contesting Candidates for Parliamentary Constituencies

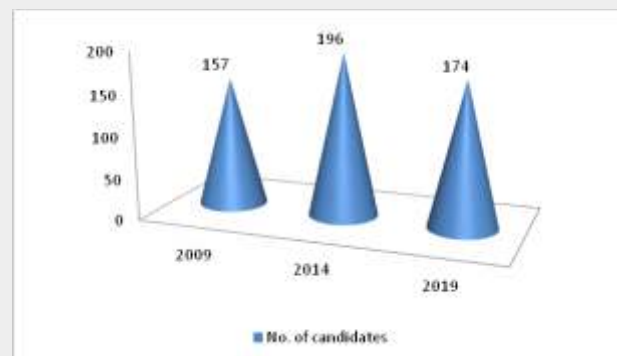
The total number of contesting candidates for the 21 Parliamentary Constituencies was 174 (149 males and 25 females). The party-wise break up was as follows:

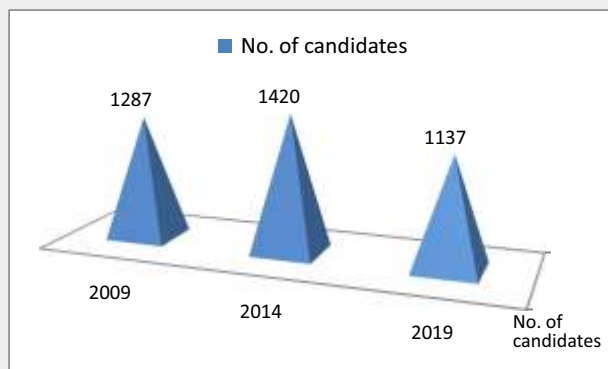

Poll

The Polls were conducted in four phases i.e. on 11.04.2019, 18.04.2019, 23.04.2019 and 29.04.2019. Generally, Polling parties were dispatched two days before the poll, except in a few urban constituencies where they were dispatched one day before the poll. On the day prior to the poll, the Sector Officers visited the polling stations to ensure the readiness of the polling parties for conduct of the poll.

Against 3,24,97,762 electors in the electoral roll, 2,37,22,341 voters cast their votes. The overall voter turnout was 73.09% (male-72.07% and female 74.18%). This was against 73.53% voting during GE 2014 and 65.3% during GE 2009.

Adjourned / Fresh Polls

In the case of 96- Patkura Assembly Constituency, due to death of one of the contesting candidate Shri Bed Prakash Agarwalla of the Biju Janata Dal on 20.04.2019, the poll was adjourned. However the Lok Sabha Elections for 96-Patkura Assembly Segment of 15-Kendrapara PC was held on the due date of poll i.e.

29.04.2019. As per Commission's order, the Biju Janata Dal party filed one nomination on behalf of the deceased candidate and the polls for the Assembly Constituency was initially adjourned to 19th May, 2019. Subsequently, due to the devastation caused by the Super Cyclonic Storm "FANI" which swept the coastal districts of Odisha including the District of Kendrapara on 3rd of May, 2019, the poll was further adjourned to 20th July 2019 as per Commission's Order.

Fresh Polls

Due to various reasons like mis-pairing of EVM-VVPAT of the Lok Sabha and Assembly Polls, violation of secrecy of voting, law and order issues etc. fresh polls were conducted in 45 Polling Stations in the State. The detailed reasons for conduct of fresh / adjourned poll are given in the Annexure.

Postal Ballots

For the first time, through a newly introduced system e-postal ballots were sent to the enrolled service voters by the Returning Officers through the Electronically transmitted Postal Ballot Paper System (ETPBS) application. After publication of final

The service voters downloaded the postal ballots at their respective Record / Unit offices and sent the postal ballot through post to the Returning Officer. All the Returning Officers, DLMTs and ALMTs were imparted training on ETPBS as this

was introduced for the first time .

Computer generated Form-12 (Application form for postal ballot paper) were issued to all the Polling Personnel deployed for elections. The ballot papers were issued to the Polling Personnel in the 3rd and last round of training and facilitation centers were set up at all the training centers. Adequate number of Gazetted officers for attesting the Form-13-A

were available at the training centers. A module on postal ballot papers was mandatorily introduced right from the level of District Level Master Trainers (DLMTs) to the training of Polling Personnel. The Polling officers and police officers on election duty and vehicle staffs cast their votes at the training centers or dispersal center or by submitting the same in the ROs office.

A total of 74,268 postal ballot papers were found valid and counted as against 31,326 (in GE 2014) which was an increase of 2.4 fold.

Poll Boycott

Due to various reasons, the voters of 27 polling stations boycotted the polls. The main cause of poll boycott was developmental issues in the local areas. The list of such polling stations where voters boycotted the poll is given in Annexure.

Counting of votes

With due approval of the Commission, counting of votes was taken up in 63 counting centres (details in **Annexure**) on 23 May 2019. Since the gap between the poll and counting day was more than a month, the EVMs were kept under three- tier security comprising CAPF, SAP and the local police. 24x7 CCTV arrangements with adequate power back up were

made in the strong rooms. Arrangements were also made in the EVM strong rooms for political parties to keep their own watch and ward, and see the CCTV footage for their own satisfaction.

During the period between the poll and the counting day, a severe cyclonic storm “ FANI” hit the coastal districts of the State at Puri on 3rd May 2019. In view of the predicted severity of the storm, all DEOs & Collectors took repairs and retro-fitting works like re-inforcement of the Strong room, polythene sheets over the roof and verandah, and other safety measures for preventing the storm water from entering into the EVM strong room.

In view of the severe heat wave prevailing in the all part of the State, all DEOs & Collectors made air conditioning arrangements at all the counting halls as per instruction of the Chief Electoral Officer. Since mandatory counting of VVPAT slips of 5 Polling Stations each for the AC and AS was to be done, it was expected that the counting process would take 20-24 hours. The air conditioned environment at the counting halls was well appreciated by the political parties, media and counting personnel.

Keeping in view the protracted hours for the counting of votes, Commission approved the proposals for additional counting tables over and

above the 14 tables in each hall, wherever infrastructure and space was available.

On the day of counting, three-tier security arrangements were provided at the counting centres. The round wise trends and results of counting were uploaded through online SUVIDHA application for which an IT Cell was made functional in each counting centre. The results and trends were put on the public domain on the Commission's website www.ecireresults.gov.in on real time basis.

Media persons were issued passes under the due authority of Commission for access to the Media Centres opened in all the counting centres. At the State level, a media center functioned in the CEO's office and Chief Electoral Officer briefed the media at regular intervals on the counting trends. Arrangements were made at the Biju Pattnaik Park, Bhubaneswar so that the public can view the election results on a large LED screen specially put up for the purpose.

Election Expenditure Monitoring

ELECTION EXPENDITURE MONITORING

Article 324 of the Constitution of India vests unfettered authority with the Election Commission of India for superintendence, direction and control of Parliamentary as well as Assembly election of the States/Union Territories of our country. Thus it is incumbent and obligatory on the part of Election Commission of India to ensure that each and every election is conducted in a free, fair, transparent and peaceful manner wherein a level playing field is maintained and not disturbed for all stakeholders including the candidates contesting the election and the Political Parties and the electoral process is not allowed to be vitiated by any means including misuse of money power.

The beneficial objective sought to be achieved by making the incurring or authorizing of election expenditure in excess of the prescribed limit as a corrupt practice was elucidated by the Hon'ble Apex Court in *Kanwar Lal Gupta vs Amar Nath Chawla* (AIR 1975 SC 308). The ratio decided therein is as follows:

“... The objective of the provision limiting the expenditure is twofold. In the first place, it should be open to any individual or any political party, however small, to be able to contest an election on a footing of equality with any other individual or political party, howsoever rich and well financed it may be, and no individual or political party should be able to secure an advantage over others by virtue of its superior financial strength....”

The other objective of limiting the expenditure is to eliminate, as far as possible, the influence of big money in the electoral process. If there was no limit on expenditure, political parties would go all out for collecting contributions The pernicious influence of big money would then play a decisive role in controlling the democratic process in the country....”

Section 77(1) of the Representation of People Act, 1951 provides that every candidate at an election shall either by himself or by his election agent, keep a separate and correct account of all expenditure in connection with the election incurred or authorised by him or by his election agent between the date on which he has been nominated and the date of declaration of result thereof, both dates inclusive. Further, sub-section(3) of Section 77 stipulates that the total of the said expenditure shall not exceed such amount as may be prescribed. It is also made mandatory under Section 78 of the R.P Act, 1951 that every

contesting candidate at an election shall, within thirty days from the date of election of the returned candidate or, if there are more than one returned candidate at the election and the dates of their election are different, the later of those two dates, lodge with the district election officer an account of his election expenses which shall be a true copy of the account kept by him or by his election agent under Section 77. Particulars of account of election expenses to be kept by the candidate or his election agent under Section 77 of the RP Act, 1951 have been specified under Rule 86 of the Conduct of Election Rules, 1961.

The Commission is seriously engaged in curbing the influence of money power in elections, during General elections to Assembly / Parliamentary constituencies. The Election Commission has formulated a robust mechanism for monitoring election expenditure, which was first implemented during General Election to Legislative Assembly of Bihar in 2010. This monitoring mechanism was subsequently implemented effectively and systematically. In order to monitor the election expenses of the candidate as well as the political parties, Election Commission of India has issued detailed instructions and guidelines from time to time for timely and effective monitoring of election expenditures.

For monitoring day to day election expenditure incurred by the candidate, the election expenditure monitoring mechanism had been put in place in each constituency. The structure of the expenditure monitoring mechanism comprises of Expenditure Observer, Assistant Expenditure Observer, Video Surveillance Team, Video Viewing Team, Accounting Team, Complaint Monitoring Control Room and Call Centre, Media Certification and Monitoring Committee, Flying Squad, Static Surveillance Team, Nodal Officers and Expenditure Monitoring Cell. One senior officer not below the rank of SDM/ADM is appointed by the DEO to be the Nodal Officer of Expenditure Monitoring Cell and all Teams mentioned above and the Nodal Officers constitute the Cell. Further detailed instructions have also been issued by the Commission for identifying Expenditure Sensitive Constituency and Expenditure Sensitive Pockets and keeping special attention to such constituency and pockets.

For effective compliance of the instructions/ guidelines of the Commission, following steps were taken during the Simultaneous General Election

2019 so as to properly and correctly account every election expenditure incurred by the candidates and political parties during this period: -

- Opening of a separate bank account by each contesting candidate for incurring all major election expenses through cheque / demand draft/NEFT drawn on this bank account only.
- A complaint-monitoring cell in each district with 24X7 toll free number to receive complaint from the public.
- Flying Squads, Static Surveillance Teams headed by Executive Magistrates are formed in each constituency to track illegal cash transaction or any distribution liquor or any items for bribing/ inducement of the voters and to attend to all complains of election expenditure.
- Income Tax Department was also instructed by the Commission to keep watch over all airports in the State, major railway stations, hotels, farm houses, financial brokers, cash couriers, pawn brokers and other suspicious agencies/persons engaged in movement of cash and necessary action to be taken as per the provisions of the Income Tax Act.
- DEOs were instructed to have monitoring of suspicious cash withdrawal from any bank account during election process.
- Expenditure Observers are appointed for each district with senior officers from Income Tax Department, Customs & Central Excise Department and other finance & accounts services from outside the State to oversee the election expenditure by the candidates during election.
- Assistant Expenditure Observers are appointed for each constituency, to assist the Expenditure Observers.
- Shadow Observation Register is maintained in each constituency for each candidate to record major expenses observed during the election.
- Video Surveillance Team is constituted with camera persons and Government officials in each team to videograph major election campaign expenses.
- Accounting Team is constituted in each constituency to maintain Shadow Observation Register and the folder of evidence.
- Media Certification and Media Expenditure Monitoring Committee (MCMC) constituted to monitor both print and electronic media including cable network, social media etc. for election advertisement and suspected Paid News.

- Campaign for Ethical Voting and to create awareness among voters not to accept any inducement in exchange of votes.

TRAINING:

All the officials and field functionaries involved in the election process of the Simultaneous General Election 2019 such as District Election Officer, Returning Officers, Nodal Officer Election Expenditure Monitoring, Assistant Returning Officers, Assistant Expenditure Observers, Assistant Returning Officers, Deputy Collectors Election, Master Trainers and other functionaries were imparted detailed training at the State Level and District level explaining them the instructions and guidelines issued by the Commission for effective monitoring of the election expenditures incurred or authorised by the candidate and also the expenses incurred by the Political Parties.

APPOINTMENT OF STATE LEVEL NODAL OFFICERS:

Pursuant to the instruction of the Commission, Additional CEO in the office of CEO, Odisha, Additional DG of Police, Commissioner Excise, Joint Director, Income tax were appointed as Nodal Officers were appointed in the Office of the CEO, Nodal Officer of Police, Nodal Officer Excise and Nodal Officer Income Tax respectively for effective monitoring and coordination with district level functionaries to keep close watch on the election expenditures.

TEAMS & SQUAD:

In compliance to the norms stipulated by the Commissions, different Teams and Squad viz. Video Surveillance Team, Video viewing Team, Accounting Team, Flying Squad, Static Surveillance Teams were constituted in each Assembly Constituency / Segment for effective monitoring of election expenditures of the candidates and political parties. Details of the Teams and Squad so constituted is given in the **Annexure**.

MEDIA CERTIFICATION AND MONITORING COMMITTEE:

Precertification of the political advertisement is a mandatory requirement in compliance to the order of the Hon'ble Apex Court and instruction of the Commission issued thereto. Accordingly, Media Certification and Monitoring Committee were constituted at the district level to pre-certify the advertisements of political nature made by the candidates. Similarly, State Level Media Certification and Monitoring Committee was also constituted at the CEO's level for precertification of political advertisements given by the Political Parties for

dissemination in different medias or for general party propaganda through audio or audio-visual means. State level Media Certification and Monitoring Committee after due examination of the

movement of excise materials. The seizure made by the Flying Squads, Static Surveillance Teams, Police Department and Excise Department is given in the table below:

advertisement materials submitted by the Political Parties has certified those materials that satisfy the norms stipulated by the Commission. Details of such certification is placed at **Annexure**.

Further, to keep a close watch over the political advertisements made by the Political Parties, a monitoring cell was also functional in CEO's office wherein 10 TV sets with cable connection and recording systems were provided. Radio Sets were also provided to keep watch on the political advertisement broadcasted. Besides, Newspapers published from Bhubaneswar/Cuttack were also provided to the Cell to watch the political advertisement made by the political parties in print media.

COMPLAINT MONITORING CONTROL ROOM AND CALL CENTRE:

A 24X7 Compliant Monitoring Control Room and Call Centre functioned in the CEO's office provided with Toll Free Telephone Number and 05(five) haunting lines. The Control Room received the complaints from the field and instantly transmitted to the concerned District Election Officer for necessary actions in the matters. The State Control Room received 349 complaints during the period from 15.03.2019 to 29.04.2019.

Similarly, Income Tax Department had also put up a control Room in the office of Director, Income Tax (Inv), Bhubaneswar with Toll Free Telephone Number to have close watch over the movement of huge amount of money during the election process.

SEIZURE MADE DURING THE ELECTION PROCESS:

Flying Squads, Static Surveillance Teams and Police Department had seized cash, liquor, narcotic drugs and other freebies suspected to be used for bribing the voters.

Similarly, State Excise Department had also deployed one squad each in every Assembly Constituency during the election process to monitor the illegal movement of liquor, narcotic drugs etc. within the State and also to curb the inter-State

SUBMISSION OF ELECTION EXPENSES BY THE CONTESTING CANDIDATES:

GENERAL ELECTION TO LOK SABHA - 2019

There are 174 contesting candidates in the 21 Parliamentary Constituencies of Odisha in General Elections-2019, out of which 169 candidates have submitted their statement of accounts to the concerned District Election Officers. District Election Officers on receipt of statement of accounts submitted by the contesting candidates have scrutinized and finalised the summary & scrutiny reports and submitted to Chief Electoral Officer which have been submitted to the Election Commission of India as per their instructions. Five (05) candidates have failed to lodge their account.

GENERAL ELECTION TO ODISHA LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY-2019

Similarly, there are 1127 numbers of candidates contested in 146 Assembly Constituencies of Odisha in General Elections, 2019 (Except 96-Patkura). Summary & scrutiny reports in respect of 1039 candidates have been received from all District Election Officers till Aug 2019. As reported by the DEOs 88 (Eighty-eight) candidates have failed to lodge their account within the statutory period.

Chapter - XIII

Model Code of Conduct (MCC)

Pursuant to the instructions of ECI vide letter No. 437 / 6 / 1 / ECI / INST / FUNCT / MCC / 2019 dated 10th March, 2019, enforcement of provisions of Model Code of Conduct came into immediate effect in the 30 districts of the State. The complaint / allegation / grievance petitions received from different individuals, political parties and representatives of any organizations during the period of Model Code of Conduct in force have been addressed scrupulously in the MCC Cell and the matters have been disposed of / closed in consideration to the merit of the petition.

Daily report on major MCC violations such as number of defacements removed from public as well as private property, numbers of cases recorded under wall writing, posters, banners, misuse of vehicles, violation of loud speaker Act, illegal meetings, inducement, gratification to electors, cash & kind distribution, complaint against political party, cases lodged were submitted to ECI in the prescribed format MCC-I & MCC-II every day in consultation with the Chief Electoral Officer from the date of enforcement of Model Code of Conduct in the State i.e. on dt. 10.03.2019.

Complaint Monitoring System

Pursuant to the declaration of the General Elections, one desk top application under the URL of

CEO, Odisha, Home (Elections) Department was developed. The petitions regarding violation of Model Code of Conduct received from political parties / individuals / organizations could be downloaded from the URL, perused and sent to the concerned authorities for timely disposal of the grievance / complaint. All the District Collectors were instructed to download the grievance petitions pertaining to their districts by using a unique User ID and password and upload the compliance report forthwith citing the code No./ Letter No. of this office for further course of action. With this arrangement, the CEO office was able to dispose of more than 400 numbers of petitions received by the office which could help redress the grievances in minimum possible time.

Permission / Clarification / Clearance

Permission / clarification / clearances sought for w.r.t the proposals submitted by the different Departments and Organisations of the State have been dealt in the MCC Cell in connection with enforcement of Model Code of Conduct and important decisions were taken in this regard in accordance with the suggestion of Screening Committee of the State constituted under the Chairmanship of the Chief Secretary.

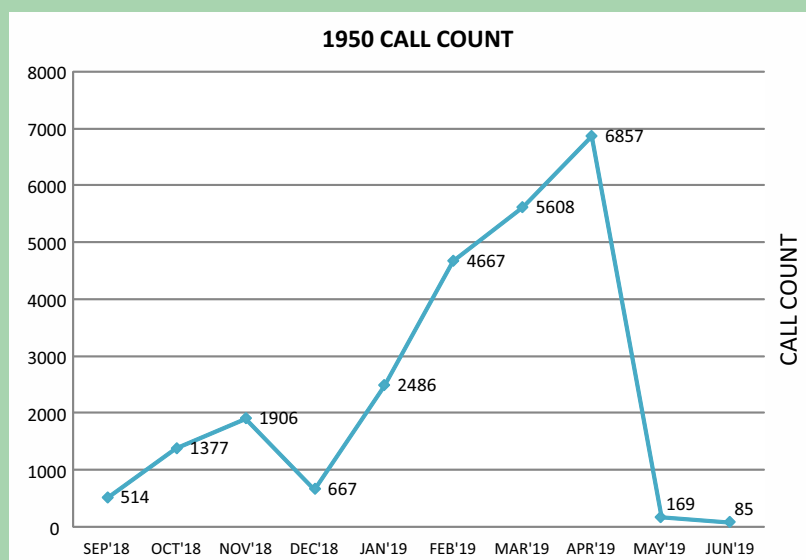

Observer Management

In order to monitor & supervise the Simultaneous General Elections, the Election Commission of India appointed 21 General Observers for 21 Parliamentary Constituencies and 46 General Observers for 146 Assembly Constituencies. Besides, 48 Expenditure Observers were deployed to supervise and monitor Election Expenditure Monitoring of 21 Parliamentary Constituencies and 146 Assembly constituencies. In order to supervise & enforce the instructions of Election Commission of India, 12 Police Observers were appointed by Election Commission of India for 21 Parliamentary Constituencies and 146 Assembly Constituencies.

For the first time, one General Observer was appointed for counting of votes on 23rd May 2019 in each of the 147 AS/ AC. Accordingly,

147 Nos. of General Observers were deployed for counting of votes.

In order to monitor expenditure incurred by candidates during the campaign period, Election Commission of India deployed 70 Expenditure Observers (21 Nos. for Parliamentary Constituencies and 49 Nos. for 146 Assembly Constituencies).

The Commission briefed and took stock of the situation from the Observers through Video Conference on 8.04.2019, 15.04.2019 and 25.04.2019.

The details of the different categories of Observer deployed in the State are in the Annexure.

The Observer Cell in the Office of CEO, Odisha was headed by Sri Manoj Kumar Swain, Deputy Secretary and he was assisted by one Desk Officer, one Section Officer and one Sr. Typist.

Systematic Voters Education & Electoral Participation (SVEEP)

As per instructions of the Election Commission of India, a comprehensive State SVEEP Plan for enhanced electoral participation for the Elections 2019 which also included strategies for the Special Revision of Electoral Roll was prepared and submitted to the Commission. The objective of the SVEEP Plan was to chalk out a sustained plan to enhance people participation in the electoral process. It is a targeted approach adopted towards meeting the various gaps in registration and voting besides spreading awareness about informed, un-intimidated and inducement- free voting under the broader frame work of civic education.

Situational Analysis

As per the Draft Electoral Roll published on 1st September 2018, the following shortcomings in the electoral roll were identified:

- In the Draft Electoral Roll-2019 published on 01.09.2018, there were 1,33,896 voters in the 18-19 age group against the projected Census population of 16.35 lakh. The eligible un-enrolled voters in this age group would have to be enrolled and issued Electors Photo Identity Cards (EPICs).
- The E-Roll Gender Ratio was 939 against the Census Ratio of 976.
- The State Photo Coverage is 97.79% and the EPIC coverage was 98.22%. In order to achieve 100% photo and EPIC coverage, photographs have to be collected from all such non-photo electors.

Elector- Population Ratio

The Elector- Population Ratio of the State is 69.75%. The 12 districts having E-P Ratio higher than the State average were identified:

The DEOs / EROs of these 12 districts were instructed to verify the Polling Station wise electors data with reference to the population of the polling area and identify anomalies. They were asked to identify DSEs, dead and shifted voters and take steps for deletion of names from the electoral roll following due procedure.

Gender Ratio

The E-Roll Gender Ratio of the State is 939 against the Census Gender Ratio of 976.

The E-Roll Gender Ratio of the following six districts was more than the District Census Gender Ratio.

The concerned DEOs were asked to identify multiple entries of women voters, and take steps for deletion of the same after following due procedure.

The E-Roll Gender Ratio and Census Gender Ratio (1018) was the same in Nabarangpur District. In all the remaining 23 districts, the E-Roll Gender Ratio was less than the Census Gender Ratio. However, the gap between the ratio was more than 50 points in the following eight districts.

These districts were asked to draw up SVEEP Plan targeting enrolment of women electors in order to bridge the gap.

Age Cohort analysis

In the Draft PER-2019, there are 1,33,896 voters against the projected population of 16.35 lakhs, as over 3.5 lakh voters shifted to the age group 20-29.

All DEOs and EROs were instructed to take intensive SVEEP for enrolment of young voters in this age group like special voter awareness camps in educational / technical institutions in partnership with NSS, NYK and CSOs; enrolment of PwDs and vulnerable sections; establish Electoral Literacy Clubs / Booth Level Awareness Groups; motivate young voters through personal contact by BLOs, Anganwadi Workers, ASHA Workers, Volunteers etc.

However, in the age group 30-59, the number of electors in the Draft Electoral Roll is more than the projected Census Population. There are 68,681 electors between 90 to 100 years of age & 5,568 electors in above 100 years of age in the Draft Electoral Roll. Electoral Registration Officers were asked to identify Demographically Similar Entries



(DSE) thrown up by ERONET, verify the same through BLOs and then delete the established repeated entries following due procedure. DEOs and EROs were instructed to verify DSEs and delete dead, shifted and repeated entries after following due procedure as per instructions of Commission.

Service Electors

All the DEOs/ EROS were instructed to dispose of the applications received through National Voters Service Portal (NVSP) and pending for inquiry and orders as per the schedule communicated by ECI.

Gap Analysis

The following areas were identified for focused interventions during the Special Summary Revision of Photo Electoral Rolls of intensive nature w.r.t. 01.01.2019 as qualifying date:

- Enrolment of youth in the 18-19 age group- There is a gap of about 12.00 lakh eligible voters in this age group against the projected population of over 16 lakh.
- The E-Roll gender ratio was 939 against the Census gender ratio of 978. It was targeted to bridge this gap further during the Summary Revision programme.
- Achieving 100% Photo and EPIC coverage.
- Enrolment of Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) who have not yet been registered as a voter
- Identification and deletion of Demographical Similar Entries, dead, shifted and repeated electors



especially in Assembly Constituencies where the Elector-Population ratio is more than 70%.

- Correction of elector detail entries

KAP Survey

Knowledge Attitude and Practices (KAP Survey)

The base line survey on “Knowledge Attitude and Practices (KAP Survey)” of the citizens of Odisha was entrusted to Nabakrushna Choudhury Centre for Development Studies (NCDS, Bhubaneswar). The KAP study followed stage sampling (Revenue Division, Assembly Constituencies, Polling Stations, Voters) in selection of respondents. The survey was conducted in 16 Assembly Constituencies from as many districts. 100 samples were randomly collected from each Polling Station during the survey. The recommendations of the survey are as follows:

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Voter registration must be done efficiently and correctly and voter list should be updated before every poll regularly.

2. Even after several cautious attempts, mistakes are found in the voter list and cards issued. The private agencies which are assigned this task play a vital role at the district level for registration and revision of voter list. Hence, the concerned BLOs and Supervisors should be vigilant enough during the whole process to avoid mistakes. Measures in

support of senior citizens and illiterate voters should be taken.

3. Proactive steps should be taken to make voters aware of complete election procedure through awareness campaign and distribution of leaflets at Panchayat level.

4. Demonstration of EVM and VVPAT as an essential exercise should be done to create public awareness, to erode technophobia and make the whole process user friendly before election.

5. Ramp ways and drinking water facilities are basic requirements that should be provided at all the Polling booth.

6. Separate queues, sitting arrangements and shed facility (particularly during summer season) should be made for PwDs, senior citizens, and lactating / pregnant women during voting.

7. Measures should be taken for identification of PwDs as most of them face difficulties in getting a medical certificate.

8. Leaflets related to election such as use of EVM, availability of Braille on EVM, VVPAT and other at the polling booth should be circulated among the voters at booth level at least once before election. The awareness level is significantly low among the voters of Southern Division compared to other two divisions. Therefore, steps should be taken to increase the awareness level of voters of this division before election.

9. In some booths, it is found that the names of voters of a single household are enrolled in different Polling booths. It creates a lot of inconvenience for them at time of voting. Therefore, the electors of one household should be listed in one polling booth.

10. Adequate security personnel should be deployed at Polling Station on the Polling day to avoid any type of unwarranted situation.

11. Measures should be taken to provide interrupted power supply in polling booths on voting day.

12. Volunteers should be temporally appointed to escort and provide assistance to patients / senior citizens and PwDs.

13. In some areas, people hesitate to enrol the names of their unmarried daughters even though they have attained 18 years of age. The main reasons are they want to hide the age of their daughters and their names can be enrolled at their in-law's places after marriage. So, awareness should be created among the people encouraging them to enrol the names of their unmarried daughters.

14. Transportation arrangements should be made for the voters who are unable to move.

Interventions

The following interventions were taken up during the Special Summary Revision 2019.

Enrolment of youth voters in the 18-19 age group -

- Electoral Literacy Clubs at the Community & Institutional level set up to generate awareness on registration & voting.
- Enrolment campaigns in academic / technical institutions – EROs held meetings with Heads of Institutions. BLOs were tagged to Institutions and liaised with Nodal Officers of such Institutions. Electoral Literacy Clubs (ELCs) at Institutions generated awareness regarding registration and voting.
- NSS volunteers were suitably trained (alongside BLOs) for identifying eligible voters, and motivating them to register.
- EROs held meetings with Resident Welfare Associations and tag concerned BLOs to liaison with Secretaries of such associations to ensure hassle free registration of residents.

Bridging the gender gap and have more inclusive electoral roll

- Booth Level Awareness Group (BAG) were activated during revision process to reach the eligible voters and ensure that all eligible women are enrolled.

- Services of Anganwadi Workers, women SHGs, ASHA workers, NGOs working for women's issues etc. were utilized as far as possible for registration of women voters.
- Special emphasis was given to enrol eligible voters of marginalized and excluded sections and Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs).

Collection of photographs from non-photo electors for achieving 100% photo coverage

- There were 6,89,339 non-photo electors in the Draft Electoral Roll 2019



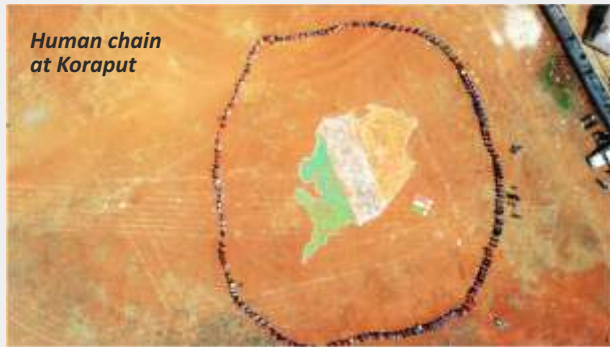

- BLOs were asked to collect photographs in Form 8 from non-photo electors.
- If the BLO was unable to collect the photographs from such residual electors, reasons for non-collection of the same was to be reported to AERO / ERO.
- Wherever possible, BLOs were encouraged to capture the photographs of the non-photo electors through their mobile phones and maintain a record of the photograph number, so that the same can be merged in E-Roll data base by the computer firm.

Bringing down the Electoral Roll E-P ratio at par with Census figures by deletion of Demographically Similar Entries (DSE) / dead/ shifted electors

- The DSEs generated out of ERONET were verified through desk analysis by the ERO. The DSEs were segregated into three categories- photograph matching, not matching and doubtful. Field verification was done by BLOs for all matching and doubtful cases. After field verification report was submitted by BLOs, and issue of statutory notice by ERO/ AERO, the repeated entries were deleted. In most of the cases the BLOs collected Form-7 form the repeated voters.
- The up-to-date list of dead persons were obtained from concerned authorities and ensured

SVEEP is a programme done in partnership with a host of organizations – Govt. Departments and other agencies. The partner agencies conducted activities within their own resources, while the outreach materials used by them were created and distributed under the supervision of the CEO.

National Voters Day 2019

The State Level function was held at Kalinga Stadium, Bhubaneswar. His Excellency the Hon'ble Governor of Odisha Prof. Ganeshi Lal graced the function as Chief Guest. His Excellency the Governor administered the Voters' Pledge to all those who were present. At the function, EPICs were distributed by the Chief Guest to 20 newly registered electors which included four PwDs and two Transgenders. The Chief Guest gave away prizes to 18 winners of State level quiz, debate, slogan writing and poster makings competitions. The Hon'ble Governor inaugurated a poster exhibition on the occasion. A model Polling Station was set up in the venue and the citizens and students were encouraged to participate in the mock poll. Special Caps and T-shirts bearing the logo on NVD and badges were distributed to the citizens and students present in the function.

Detailed instructions were issued to all District Election Officers & Collectors for celebration of National Voters' Day. Funds were placed with the DEOs and EROs for celebration of NVD at 30 Districts, 58 Sub-Divisions, 314 Blocks and Booth locations.

The following activities were also taken up at the State Level for celebration of NVD - 2019 at Bhubaneswar.

- Voters Carnival was flagged from three different points of Bhubaneswar city, covered different routes between 7.00 AM to 9.00 AM and reached the venue of State level function. Each team comprised three vehicles in the cavalcade-1 vehicle with model of EVM & VVPAT, 1 vehicle for cultural troupe and 1 vehicle with appropriate branding on EVM & VVPAT.
- A Cycle Rally by 300 students of NSS and Bharat Scouts and Guides was taken from Biju Pattnaik Park, Forest Park to Kalinga Stadium. The rally was flagged by Ms. Jayanti Behera, Para Olympic winner and State youth Icon.
- Student of various schools and colleges performed formations and displayed the National Flag, ECI logo, EVM & VVPAT at the State level function.
- Flash dance was organized at different locations in the capital city to create awareness among the public.

The State level function celebration was streamed live on CEO's facebook-page and the events have been tweeted on CEO's Handle. CEC's NVD message was disseminated through print & electronic media. A float depicting the EVM –VVPAT participated in the State Level Republic Day parade on 26th January 2019.

The State representatives and volunteers of NSS, Bharat Scouts and Guides, NCC, NYK and Odisha Election Watch participated actively in the State and district level function.

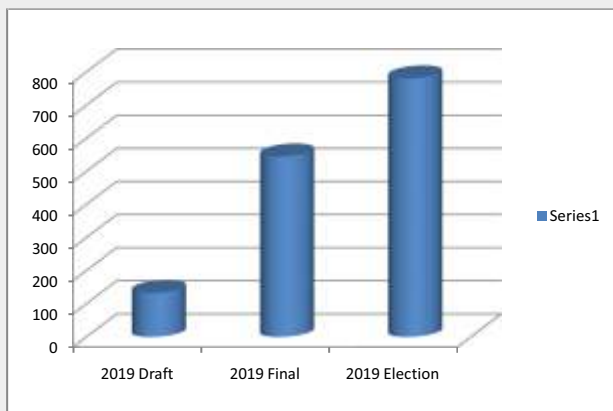
Evaluation and Documentation

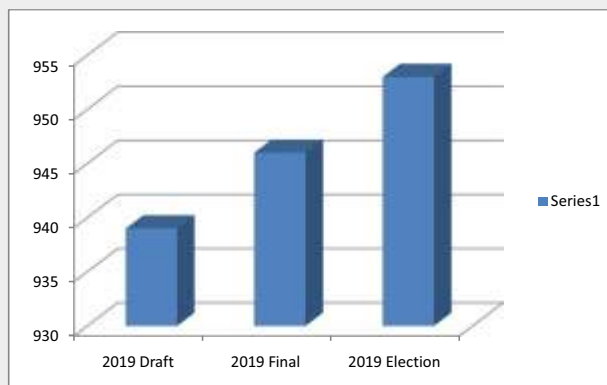

Achievements/ Improvements

- Youth enrolment increased from 9% to 49% of the projected population. In terms of numbers, voters in 18-19 age group increased from 1.33 lakh (in draft roll 2019) to 5.45 lakh (in Final Roll 2019) and to 7.81 lakh (during GE 2019).



- E- Roll gender ratio improved from 939 (in Draft Roll 2019) to 953 (in the E-Roll Election 2019) (an increase of 14 points)



- 6,97,387 women voters were included in the electoral roll against 5,03,859 male voters during the period Sep 2018- April 2019.
- Overall Turnout 73.21%
- Overall female turnout 2.09% higher than male turnout
- 74268 postal ballot papers valid and counted as against 31326 (in 2014)- 2.4 fold increase
- Some Assembly Constituencies had very high female voter turnout in GE 2019 as against GE 2014.

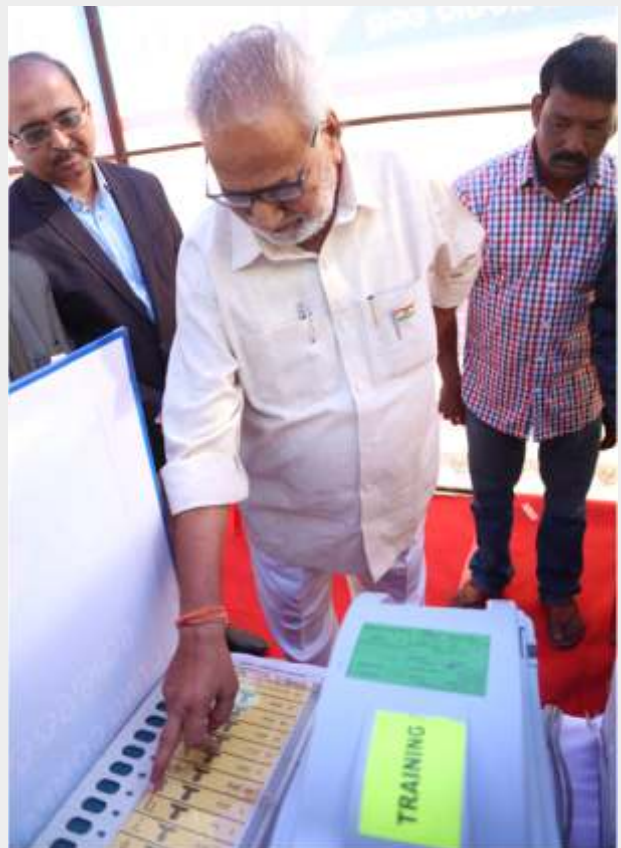

Accessible Elections

The theme of Election Commission of India for the elections, knowledge sharing, building partnership General Elections 2019 was “No Voter to be Left Behind and commitment with Ministries and Departments, Behind”. This was committed to include all categories setting up of Electoral Literacy Clubs in Educational of voters in the electoral process to achieve the Institutions, building partnership with Civil Society desired objectives of universal adult surface as per Constitutional and Legislative Mandate given to the Commission.



Organizations, utilizing the potential of the media to increase the electoral participation of PwDs, deploying poll volunteers from among future voters and to assist PwDs voters, training and sensitization of staff and special four tired committees on Accessible Elections.

While the Election Commission has been issuing directions for inclusion of Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) in the electoral process from

time to time especially in the wake of Supreme Court Judgements, the Commission is committed to build an equal access frame work for empowering PwDs and support initiatives for improved service offerings to enhance their electoral participation.

The Election Commission adopted a Strategic Framework on Accessible Elections in the National Consultation at New Delhi held on 3rd-4th July 2018.

The strategic frame work inter area includes identifying barriers and findings solutions to the same, voter registration and polling, inclusive voter education, leveraging technology for accessible

State, District and Assembly Constituency level Committees

The State Steering Committee on Accessible Elections (SSCAE) was constituted vide Home (Elections) Department Office Order No.7836 / Elec. dated 12.09.2018. The Committee comprised of 11 members with Chief Electoral Officers as Chairperson. The 1st meeting of the Committee was held on 19.09.2018 and subsequent meeting on 11.03.2019.

Commission of India and instructions issued therein, all the Electoral Registration Officers were instructed to map the PwD voters in the electoral roll. Polling Station wise electors with Disabilities on four categories namely visually impaired, hearing and speech impaired, locomotor disabilities and other category were identified by the Booth Level Officers during house to house visits as part of the Special Summary Revision of Photo Electoral Rolls 2019.

The Special Summary Revisions of Photo Electoral Rolls commence with Draft Publication on 01.09.2018 and the Final Roll was published on 21.01.2019. During this period a total of 1.88 lakh voters were mapped as PwD voters.

The EROs were instructed to continue the flagging of PwDs during the Continuous updation of electoral rolls and the number of PwD voters flagged in the electoral roll stood 5,56,458 in the electoral roll which was used during the Simultaneous General Elections 2019. The AC wise and district wise number of voters flagged is given in the Table.

Voter Registration

During the Special Summary Revision of Photo Electoral rolls, 2019, special campaign day was observed on 7th, 14th and 28th October, 2018 at all the Polling Stations in the State. Further, with Commission's approval, a Special Campaign day was observed on 5th October 2018 specifically for registration of PwD voters at all the GP Offices.

As part of the exercise for registration of voters, house to house visits were carried out by BLOs to ensure that no PwDs are left out as identification / mapping exercise.

The database of the PwDs as per final voter list was used for advance planning for providing dummy braille ballot sheets to the Polling Stations and transport facilities to PwD voters on the poll day.

Poll Day Facilitation

Wheel chairs were provided in 35563 Polling Stations (over 95%) out of the total 37606 Polling Stations.

Braille Ballot Papers

Braille dummy ballot sheets were printed at Computerized Red Cross Printing Press, Berhampur and supplied to 25,336 Polling Stations where there were visually impaired voters.

Poll Volunteers

DEOs and Collectors were instructed to map two

volunteers per Polling Station to assist the PwD voters on the poll day. These Volunteers were in the age group of 14-18 years and were from NSS, NCC, NYK, Bharat Scouts and Guides.

The volunteers were given T-Shirts with suitable branding and a remuneration of Rs. 100/- each was provided for their lunch on the poll day.

Training and Capacity Building:

A State level workshop was held on 25.09.2018 at SC & ST Research Training Institute, Bhubaneswar which was attended by all District Social Security Officers and selected NGOs / CSOs working in disability sector as well as various officials of line Department.

A training Module on Accessible Elections was included in all the training sessions of District Level Master Trainers (1st round) held during Oct- Nov



2018 at the State level

Etiquette Training / Module on Accessible Elections was included during training of all District Election Officers (DEOs), Returning Officers/ District Level Master Trainers (2nd round) / Polling Personnel at State and district levelsheld in Feb- March 2019.

Transport Facility to PwD Voters:

The polling station wise data base of PwDs, culled out from the voters list, was made available to the BLOs prior to the poll day. The Booth Level Officers identified those PwD voters with visually impairment, locomotor& mental disabilities who should be provided with transport facilities on the



poll day.

A Special vehicle pass was designed by CEO's Office and all the DEOs were instructed to print required number of passes. The BLOs handed over the passes to those PwD voters who required transport facility to the polling station and back.

The Booth Level Officers manned the facilitation desk on the poll day at the concerned Polling Station and provided necessary assistance to the PwD voters along with young volunteers.

The DEOs requisitioned small vehicles like auto rickshaws , Tata Magic etc. and Block Social Security Officers and Nodal Officers monitored the deployment of vehicles to the Polling Station areas for taking the PwD voters and transporting him/her to the polling station and back to his/her residence . Over 18000 vehicles were deployed throughout the State for transporting PwD voters to the Polling Stations.

Assured Minimum Facilities (AMF) to the polling station:

As per Commission's mandate, efforts were made to make Polling Stations accessible to all PwD voters. Either temporary/ permanent ramps as per prescribed specifications were provided at nearly all the Polling Stations. More than 95% of the polling stations had separate toilet for male / female and electricity connection. Wheel-chairs manned by volunteers were provided in almost 95% of the polling stations. Different posters highlighting the facilities like companion voters, how to vote, use of VVPAT etc. were displayed at all the polling stations.

Accessibility Observers

The three Revenue Divisional Commissioners- Northern, Southern and Central Divisions were appointed as Accessibility Observer under the orders of the Election Commission of India. The

Accessibility Observers visited the polling stations in the districts under their jurisdiction, took stock of the minimum facilities available in the polling stations, interacted with election officials, PwD Voters, volunteers and other stake holders and submitted their reports to the Commission through CEO, Odisha.

As per the observers reports collated, it was seen that while the public in general and the PwD voters in particular were satisfied and commended the efforts like transport facility, wheel chair and volunteer assistance, dummy braille ballot sheet, awareness generation, sensitive polling personnel, priority voting etc. made by the Election Commission, the only scope of improvement was providing accessible toilets at the polling stations and sign language interpreters at the polling station level.

Inclusive Voter Education:

Focused interventions under ECI's flagship, Systematic Voter Education and Electoral Participation (SVEEP) was done to engaged PwDs and also to sensitise the friends, the families, polling officials, security officials and other stake holders.

Audio and video materials were developed and broadcast / telecast to inform the voters regarding the facilities available in the polling stations and to motivate them to come out and vote.

Extensive coverage by the media on the poll day also motivated the voters to participate in the electoral process.

Communication Strategies:

The process of voting and usage of EVM and VVPAT was explained to the voters through EVM & VVPAT demonstrations at the village level, spots through television media, posters at the polling stations and through hoardings at conspicuous public places. Radio jingles highlighting facilities provided to PwDvoters, and alternative identity documents to be taken to the polling station was also broadcast through AIR, Cuttack and FM channels. The CEO's website was made accessible.

Shri Pramod Bhagat and Miss Jayanti Behera both Para Olympics sports person were appointed as PwD State Icons.

PwD App:

The Election Commission of India launched a PwD App for providing information to PwD voters and facilities available to the polling stations.



Partnerships

The Director, Social Security and Empowerment of Persons with Disability (SSEPD) Department was appointed as State Disability Coordinator. The Department provided wheel chairs to more than 90% of the polling stations.

Swabhimaan, Bhubaneswar at the State level and several other NGOs at the district level were associated with the DEOs for training and support services to PwDs voters.

At the field level, Electoral Literacy Clubs in educational institutions and Chunav Pathshala at the polling station level created a positive environment and culture for equal access, empathy and dignity of the PwDs voters leading to their enhanced participation in the electoral process.

Mobile based Vehicle Tracking System

The Sector Magistrates carry the Reserve EVMs & VVPATs with them on Poll day for replacement of defective EVM/VVPAT in Polling Station during Mock Poll/Actual Poll. As the SOs are moving from one Polling Station to other during Poll, safeguarding the EVMs is a challenging task. In order to safeguard the EVMs/VVPAT on transit, during Simultaneous General Elections-2019, the Chief Electoral Officer, Odisha implemented a real time mobile-based location and movement tracking application to track the movement of Sector Magistrates (carrying reserve EVM/VVPAT).

Developed by: Ajatus Software, Bhubaneswar

Implementation Model:

1. The mobile numbers of Sector Magistrate were registered in the system.
2. The Internet & GPS were switched on in the mobile at the start of the movement of Sector Magistrate. The system was capturing the Geo Coordinates (Latitude & longitude) as the vehicle of Sector Magistrate moves.
3. The movement was reflected on the map through the web based application developed as interface for CEO & DEO.
4. The system reflected the halting time of vehicle. In case vehicle was stopped for more than one hour at a particular place, the vehicle was shown in Red colour on the map.
5. The system was having a facility for the Sector Officers to send SMS message in case of any urgency during their movement so that necessary support or help can be provided from DEO/RO/Police. This facility has helped the Sector officers as well as the DEOs to take timely action on poll day.
6. CEO has the privilege to see all tracking of all vehicles and DEO has the privilege to see the tracking of the vehicles of his/her district only.
7. DEO has the rights to form new sectors and enter the details of the Sector Magistrate

The advantages of the system

1. Real time tracking
 2. Easy implementation.
 3. No exclusive GPS device is required.
 4. Cost effective solution
- The system was implemented successfully in all

district during Poll. Total 4361 vehicles were tracked in 4 phases of Poll. The system was developed by M/S AJATUS Systems, Bhubaneswar.

The Assembly Constituency wise vehicles tracked is given below (Annexure-I)

Webcasting in sensitive booths on Poll day

In order to keep a hawk eye on Polling Booths to avoid any malpractices in the Election Polling Booth and to ensure transparency in the Elections, it is imperative to have an Administrative auto monitoring system with secured Video Streaming Surveillance Camera to monitor sensitive Polling Booth.

During Simultaneous General Election-2019, all the Election proceedings of the sensitive booths were monitored live from the offices of ECI/CEO/DEO. Live Webcast helped the Election administrator to see activities in the Polling Stations during Poll and took appropriate action on suspicious behaviors. The system was a robust video surveillance system with video stream availability and high-quality video of Polling Booths at low bandwidth. The application was a secured system and only the authorized users were able to see the webcasting

Implementing Agency:

V Mukti Solutions Pvt. Ltd, Ahmadabad.

Implementation Model

1. Authorized user logs in to the application through the URL given for the webcasting
2. Then the webcasting sites (Multiple) appear on the screen.
3. The webcasting site displays the camera serial number along with Polling Station number.
4. Any suspicious activities observed by the user is immediately brought in to the notice of the authority.
5. Authority immediately contacts the concerned BLO, Sector Officer, and Presiding officer by using the communication system (.VCF files) developed. If required, the Security forces deployed in the PS were also instructed to take immediate action to stop the unlawful activities.
6. The entire proceedings of Poll Day activities in sensitive booths were recorded and kept in the safe custody of DEO.
7. Wherever the Network issue arose for which webcasting was not possible, in such cases, the proceedings were recorded.

Poll day Push SMS system

Message relating to Critical activities to minimise human error during poll were pushed through SMS on the day before the poll and Poll day. This has reduced the human errors considerably during poll. The messages were pushed to Presiding Officers, Sector officers and BLOs. List of Messages Pushed is given at Annexure-I

Implementation Model

1. On the day before Poll messages regarding providing facilities like sheds and drinking water, Priority Poll etc. were pushed to the BLOs and sector officers.
2. On the day of Poll messages like Mock Poll process and clearing the Mock Poll Data, VVPAT slips etc. were given to the Presiding officers
3. Sector officers were reminded to ensure no cross pairing of EVMs & VVPATs

Advantages of the system

1. Minimised the EVM and VVPAT clearance cases.
2. Minimised Cross Pairing of EVMs & VVPATs cases

List of Messages pushed

For Presiding Officers

1. Please commence the mock poll at 5.30 AM. After completion of mock poll, do not forget to clear mock poll data in Control unit and remove VVPAT slips.

2. Before sealing the Control Unit for actual poll, remember to press the clear button to clear any previous data. Check no slips are there in VVPAT before sealing.
3. Presiding Officers must ensure that no one except the Voter enters into the Voting Compartment. In case voter complains about the malfunctioning of EVM and VVPAT, the Presiding officer may enter in to the Voting compartment along with the Polling Agents.
4. Braille Dummy Ballot Sheets should be available with Presiding Officer wherever there are blind voters. Facilitate Blind Voters.

For Sector Officers:

1. Replacement during Mock Poll: non-functional CU must be replaced with functional CU Only, non-functional of BU must be replaced with functional BU Only, non-functional of VVPAT must be replaced with VVPAT Only,
2. Replacement during Actual Poll: (A) In case CU or BU or both are non-functional, replace entire set i.e. CU, BU, and VVPAT. (B) In case VVPAT is non-functional, replace only VVPAT,
3. Replacement policy: Sector Officer must be careful while replacing defective EMV & VVPAT. Defective EVM & VVPAT of Assembly Election must be replaced with EVM, VVPAT carried by them for Assembly Election only. Similarly, Defective EVM & VVPAT of Parliamentary Election must be replaced with EVM, VVPAT carried by them for Parliamentary Election only.
4. Two hourly Voter turnout must be communicated by the Sector Officers to Concerned RO either through WhatsApp or SMS or other means.

For BLOs

1. BLOs must be present in the respective Polling Stations during Polling.
2. All BLOs must ensure availability of drinking water during Polling period. Also ensure waiting shed made with chairs available at Polling stations.
3. Please facilitate Priority Voting to persons with disability, Old & Infirm Voters.

Counting Data Monitoring System.

A Google sheet application was developed for monitoring the round wise counting data from counting centres. This was used as an alternative to SUVIDHA application for fetching round wise counting data from counting centres. The system

was developed in such a way that data of one counting centre cannot be seen by other counting centres. However, CEO can see the entire state data and DEOs can see the Assembly Constituency data of concerned districts. Operators were given permission to enter/edit the data input portion only hence, cannot tamper anything in the protected area. RO present in the counting hall can see the trends on the system as and when data is entered by the operator.

Developed by: Technical Team of CEO's Office

Implementation model.

1. Each RO-AC/ARO-PC were provided with separate protected Google sheets.
2. One day was given for practice.
3. The data were cleared before the counting started centrally from CEOs office.
4. After counting started, operator enters the data of the round in SUVIDHA as well as Google Sheet.
5. The data entered by operator automatically reflected in the dash board of CEO/DEO

Advantages of the System

1. In case of low Internet bandwidth, the real time information can be fetched from google sheet.
2. In case of failure of SUVIDHA, data can be obtained from Google Sheet and forwarded to commission.
3. Easy to use Google Sheet.
4. Secured Google sheet application. One cannot see or change the data of others. Similarly, Operator cannot edit or enter anything except in the un protected area of the Google sheet.
5. Trend display there and then

Complaint Monitoring System

After enforcement of Model Code of Conduct (MCC), the complaints from various corners like Political Parties, individuals etc. are lodged in writing in the office of the CEO. CEO sends those complaints to respective DEOs for necessary compliances either by post or email or fax etc.. The DEOs then submits Action Taken report to office. This process takes time and CEO is unable to monitor the progress made by the DEOs in real time basis. In order to monitor the progress of the complaint a Client Server based application was developed. CEO uploads the complaint in the system and that goes to the concerned DEO. Concerned DEO then assigns the complaint to the concerned officer. The concerned

officer takes the action and uploads the ATR . CEO sees the ATR.

Developed by: Technical Team of CEO's Office

Implementation Model

1. The Officer in charge of Complaint Monitoring, uploads the complaint in the system by mentioning the DEO, who shall take action report compliance.
2. The concern DEO receives the complaint in his/her User drop box .
3. DEO assigns the Complaint to the concerned officer to enquire and submit the report.
4. DEO then finalizes the report and uploads the ATR in the system.
5. CEO then sees the ATR and status of the complaint. In case further action is required, then CEO resends the case to DEO by mentioning action to be taken.

Advantages of the System

1. Real-time monitoring of progress of the system.
2. Instant forwarding of complaints to the concerned DEO
3. Timely compliances of the complaint.
4. User credential based system
5. Secured system

Automation of Daily Report

(on Law and Order violation, MCC, and Liquor monitoring)

During the Election process, Election Commission of India (ECI) monitors incidences of violations of law and order, violation in Modal Code of Conduct (MCC), and seizure of liquor on daily basis. A role based, process flow oriented web application was developed to monitor these activities in the State. The software was implemented in all 30 districts of the State with users from Police, Excise, District Administration who provide daily data on incidents of violence (law and order), violation of MCC, seizure of cash/liquor/other items. The reporting structure was defined prior to the implementation of software and specific time-line was given for each level of reporting.

Developed by: NIC, Odisha State Centre

Implementation Model

- a. The users use the application to feed the data related to Law &order, MCC etc. by logging into the system.
- b. The data automatically goes to the State Nodal

Officer (Police & Excise) and they consolidated reports using the system and forwards the same to CEO.

- c. On getting satisfactory reports from SNOs , CEO, takes the hard copy of the report and submits the same to ECI.

Advantages of the System

- a. Decentralised data capture from source (SP office, Dist Excise Office)
- b. Auto-consolidation of reports based on pre-defined logic
- c. Return option for correction of wrong data
- d. Availability of consolidated as well as detail report
- e. Centralised database to store and retrieve data as and when required

The role based and web enabled software was developed in .NET environment using SQL Server 2012 and ASP.NET and deployed at National Data Center (NDC), Bhubaneswar. The software was implemented in all 30 districts of Odisha. Reports generated through the System is placed at Annexure-III.

Randomization of Polling Personnel Deployment

Government/PSU employees are deployed at polling stations on Polling day for conduct of Election. To ensure free and fair conduct of election, employees are drafted and deployed at polling stations using three stage randomisation process as specified by Election Commission of India (ECI). Polling Personnel Randomisation software was implemented to draft and deploy Government/PSU employees at each polling station.

Implementation Model

- a. Capturing employee data in the system
- b. Validation and assign roll to each employee. (Presiding Officer, Polling Officer etc.)
- c. Draft 120% employees from the employee pool as per guidelines of ECI.

- e. Assigning polling stations to polling groups as per the guidelines of ECI
- f. Generate Form 12 by fetching Electoral Roll data
- g. Generate identity cards for the polling personnel.
- h. Generate different reports in the prescribed format of ECI (appointment order, training schedule and attendance, stage wise MIS reports, other abstract reports)

For the first time in Odisha, female employees were included as polling personnel. They were deployed at polling stations located in Urban areas and within 10 KM from the Urban location. In one polling station, maximum 2-3 female polling personnel were deployed. In addition to this, few Model polling stations were identified in every district where all polling personnel were females.

The software is web based and role based. The software was implemented in all 30 districts of Odisha with due approval from CEO, Odisha. The randomisation processes are executed in the presence of DEO, Election Observer and video-graphed.

Randomization of Counting Personnel**Deployment**

On the counting day, counting of votes is being carried out by government/PSU employees at counting centers. To ensure smooth and full proof counting, employees are drafted and deployed at counting centers using three stage randomisation process as specified by Election Commission of India (ECI). Polling Personnel Randomisation for Counting software was implemented to draft and deploy counting personnel at Counting Centers. Different functionalities include:

c-VIGIL Application

There was a lack of fast information channel to transmit and track complaints on MCC violations. Delay in reporting of Model Code of Conduct (MCC) violations has often resulted in the culprits escaping detection from the flying squads of Election Commission entrusted to ensure enforcement of Model Code of Conduct. Further, lack of any documented, untampered, evidence in the form of pictures or videos was a major hurdle in establishing the veracity of a complaint ex-post facto. The Commission's experience has also shown a significant percentage of reporting was false or inaccurate, which led to wastage of precious time of Field Units. Further, the absence of a robust response system to quickly and accurately identify the scene of occurrence with the help of geographical location details hampered election officers' ability to reach the spot on time to apprehend the violators.

The cVIGIL was almost filled in all these gaps and created a fast-track complaint reception and redressal system. cVIGIL is an innovative mobile application for citizens to report Model Code of Conduct and Expenditure violations during the elections. cVIGIL, a user-friendly and easy to operate the android App, which was used for reporting violations by the citizen with effect from 18-Mar-2019 for Simultaneous General Elections-2019.

Implementation Model

1. Citizen downloads the Mobile App and makes the mobile Internet & GPS on with High Accuracy setting. The Citizen can lodge the complaint as anonymous user or registered user. Registered users can get the periodic status of their complaint.
2. A citizen clicks a picture or records a 2-minute video. The Photo / Video is uploaded on the app,

- along with an automated location mapping by the Geographic Information System. After its successful submission, the citizen gets a Unique ID to track and receive follow up updates on his mobile. A citizen can report many incidents in this manner and will get a unique id for each report for follow up updates.
- Once the citizen has reported the complaint, the information beeps in the District Control Room from where it is assigned to a Field Unit within 5 minutes. A field unit consists of Flying Squads, Static Surveillance Team, Reserve team e.t.c. Each Field Unit will have a GIS-based mobile application called 'cVIGIL Investigator', which allows the field unit to directly reach the location by following the GIS cues and navigation technology and take action.
 - The Assigned FST proceeds to the location of incident, takes action and submits its report through a mobile App called "Investigator APP". This process has to be completed within 45 minutes. After a Field Unit has acted upon the complaint, the field report is sent by them online through the Investigator App to the concerned Returning Officer for decision and disposal. If the incident is found correct, the information is sent to the National Grievance Portal of the Election Commission of India for further action and the vigilant citizen is informed about the status within 100 minutes.

Advantages of the Application

- It only allows Live Photo/ video of 2 minutes with auto location capture from within the app to ensure digital evidence for flying squads to act upon in a time-bound manner.
- Citizens can immediately report on incidents of political misconduct within minutes of having witnessed them and without having to rush to the office of the returning officer.
- Automatic Alerts about an incident goes to DCC and FST/SST etc. that prompts the officers to take action.
- The system connects citizens with District Control Room, Returning Officer, and Field Unit (Flying Squads) / Static Surveillance Teams, thereby, creating a rapid and accurate reporting, action and monitoring system.
- Registered users get the status regularly as and when an activity happens.

- Observers can track the entire process through the "Observers Mobile App"
- cVIGIL application was used only within geographical boundary of States where elections were being held.
- The cVIGIL user gets 5 minutes to report an incidence after having clicked a picture or a video. The app will not allow uploading of the pre-recorded images/ videos, neither would it allow users to save photos/videos clicked from this app into the phone gallery directly.
- To prevent misuse of the system and to avoid repetitive complaints from the same spot, the system forces time delay of 5 minutes between successive complaints by the same person. District Controller has the option of dropping duplicate, frivolous and unrelated cases even before the cases are assigned to the field unit.

SUVIDHA Application

SUVIDHA, a bunch of web application and Mobile Apps developed by Election Commission (EC) was used in recently conclude Simultaneous General Election 2019. The Application is accessed through www.suvidha.eci.gov.in.

Following are the components of SUVIDHA

SUVIDHA: Nomination Module

This component of SUVIDHA web application was used primarily for nomination process. The entire nomination process was captured through this application. It started with digitization of Nominations filed by the candidates and their affidavits, Scrutiny of Nominations, allocation of symbols, withdrawal of candidature and ends with Form 7A generation. This application was used effectively. The Affidavits submitted by the applicants are automatically pushed to another application called www.affidavits.eci.gov.in and public can view the affidavits there.

1. After the nomination filing time is over in a day, the ARO(PC)/RO(AC) logs into the system using the credentials.
2. Enters the Nomination data furnished by the applicant in the form given in the application.
3. uploads the affidavits
4. On the day of scrutiny, enters/updates the applicant data.
5. After the time for withdrawal is over, ARO/RO finalizes the candidates by serializing their names as per EC guideline.
6. Generates Form-7A

SUVIDHA : Poll Day Monitoring Module

This component was used on the Poll day for capturing the 2 hourly voter turnout and final voter turnout. ARO/ROs were using this module for uploading the PC & AC two hourly Voter turnout effectively. The system has also the facility to enter final voter turnout Polling Station wise. The system captures gender wise voter turnout (Male, Female, Others). The system also generates report reflecting elector's data voter turnout and percentage of turnout

The data of Poll Turnout are pushed to an Android Mobile App called **Voter Turnout** for public view

Implementation mode/

1. RO/ARO collects the voter turnout information (Percentage of turnout) from sector officers / presiding officers.
2. RO/ARO logs in to the system and enters the collected figures (Percentage) in SUVIDHA.
3. After Voting is completed, RO/ARO enters the end of poll percentage, which is tentative.
4. Once the Polling party arrived at Headquarters, RO/ARO enters the data for the AC/AS i.e. male, female, others, total turnout by seeing Form 17-C & Presiding Officers Diary.
5. After verification the turnout data is finalized by CEO.

Advantages:

1. Real time digitization of Voter turnout data on the day of Poll.
2. Availability of voter turnout data to the public through the mobile app.

SUVIDHA: Counting Module

This component was used on counting day to capture round wise counting data from the counting centre. After completion of each round of EVM counting, the data was fed in to the system from the counting centre itself. It has resulted in getting the real-time data. The Postal Ballot votes were being also entered from the Counting centre as and when available. After completion of each round and Postal Ballot entry, the result is automatically known from the system and winners are notified.

The round wise Counting data from SUVIDHA Application was automatically pushed to an Android Mobile App called Voter Helpline App.

Further the data was also pushed to the portal www.results.eci.gov.in .

Implementation model

1. Round wise EVM counting data was tabulated
2. Tabulated EVM data was entered in Suvidha by the operator
3. The Postal Ballot Votes were also entered in to SUVIDHA as and when available
4. The Service Voter data from ETPBS were calculated and entered in to the SUVIDHA application
5. After all, EVM and Postal Ballot data entered, result is finalized by RO
6. The winner is declared by RO.

Advantages:

1. Round wise counting information was entered in real time.
2. Availability of Round wise counting information to the public through the mobile app Voter Helpline.

Citizen Centric Mobile Apps and Portals

1. Voter Helpline App: This app was used by the citizen to know the enrolment of name in Electoral Roll, Registration of new Elector, Deletion and Correction of Electoral data. This app was also used by the citizen to know the result trend and final result on counting day.
2. Voter Turnout App: This App was used on the day of Poll by the citizens to know the voter turnout.
3. PWD App: This app was used by the PwD voters for making request to map as PwD, New voter registration, requesting wheel chair on Poll day,

Complaint registration by PwDs, Locating Booth, To know Polling officials etc.

4. c-Vigil Citizen App: This app was used by the citizen to register the MCC violation complaint from the incident location.
5. National Voter Service Portal (NVSP) www.nvsp.in: This portal was used by the citizens for requesting online to register their name as elector, to make corrections in the electors data, to delete the name from the Electoral Roll . Electors can know the status of their request.
6. www.affidavits.eci.gov.in : This portal was used to display the affidavits filed by the candidates during nomination.
7. www.results.eci.gov.in : This portal was used by the citizen to know the trend on the counting day.
8. National Grievances Services Portal (NGSP) <https://eci-citizenservices.eci.nic.in/>: This is an integrated Grievance service portal. All grievances are registered here and addressed by the ERO/RO/DEOs. Citizens lodged their grievances in this portal directly, The State/District Contact Centre Agents were also fed the complaints they received from citizens in this portal.

Voter Helpline

[State Contact Centre (SCC) & District Contact Centre (DCC)]

As per the direction of Election Commission of India SCC & DCCs were opened and made operational in the state in order to facilitate the voters to know information relating to the Electoral Roll, Polling station, how to enrol, ERO contacts etc. Primarily the contact centres handle queries relating to Information, Feedback, Suggestions, and Complaints (IFSC) in nature.

The Contact Centres were equipped with professional agents, head phone, mike, call recorder, desktop, printer scanner etc.

SCC handled **17463** till 30-Apr-2019

The SCC & DCC will run throughout the year

Communication Plan (.VCF files)

The contact details of Sector Officers, BLOs, Presiding Officers were captured in .VCF format. The officers in the field level could be contacted directly from the office of CEO to resolve field level issues like availability of common facilities like drinking water, shed, priority polling etc.. The system has also helped in avoiding unlawful actions in Polling

stations for smooth and fare conduct of elections. The BLOs and Sector officers of concerned Pooling Station were contacted directly from office of CEO upon receiving information regarding unlawful activities. Similarly status of Polling, replacement of EVM/VVPAT etc were also directly obtained from the Presiding officers/BLOs/SOs.

ETBPS System

Service Voters: In order to provide convenient and easy to use system for voters working in Defense to register themselves to cast their votes through postal ballot, online system has been developed for

registration and acceptance of forms as Service Voters. In this system, DEO will assign the Assembly Constituency to Service Voter, then the form will be displayed to ERO of that Assembly Constituency and ERO will accept or reject or reassign the form. There are 43,357 service electors has been enrolled as Service Voters.

Electronically transmitted Postal Ballot System (ETPBS) is developed by Election Commission of India for the use of the Service Voters. It is a fully secured system, having two layers of security. Secrecy is maintained through the use of OTP and PIN and no duplication of casted Electronically Transmitted Postal Ballot (ETPB) is possible due to the unique QR Code

This system enables the entitled service voters to cast their vote using an electronically received postal ballot from anywhere outside their constituency. The voters who make such a choice will be entitled for Postal Ballot delivered through Electronic Media for a particular election.

The developed System is implemented in line with the existing Postal Ballot System. Postal Ballot will be transmitted through Electronic means to the voters. It enables the voters to cast their vote on an electronically received postal ballot from their preferred location, which is outside their originally assigned voting constituency. This system is an easier option of facilitating voting by the electors as the time constraint for dispatch of postal ballot has been addressed using this system.

During General election 2019, the Service Voter's Ballot paper were generated and sent to the service voters through ETPBS system as e-Postal Ballot. On counting day, the Postal ballots were validated and counted. Due to non-functioning of ETBPS, e-Postal ballot were verified and validated manually in most of the counting centres as per the directions of ECI.

EVM Management System

EVM Management System (EMS) was used for entire life cycle of EVMs during recently concluded General Election-2019. The application was used successfully in the state for transfer of EVMs, captures the FLC process, training, randomization, strong room management etc. Trained SLMTs have trained the DLMTs on EMS. An officer at the level of Jt. CEO was exclusively looking after the entire EVM management.

The EVM Management System has two components;

- Web-based application with core functions related to EVM business process and was used by user such as Manufacturer, ECI, CEOs, DEOs, Warehouse In-charge etc. Role based access was provided to different users at same URL
- Mobile application was a supporting application, which was used by temporary users for mainly scanning at warehouse level during sending and receiving EVM Units, FLC, receiving in AC after 1st randomization, etc.

Usage of Google Tools in the Electoral Process

(Google Doc, Google Forms, Google Sheet)

Mountains of information, data are collected from the field level during Electoral process for monitoring various activities. Traditionally, the information was collected from the field level through FAX,email, physical letters, which takes lot of time. Precious man hours are spent in contacting and collecting and compiling information from field level by the office of CEO. This not only consumes time but also engages the resources in carrying out futile exercise.

In order to utilise the resources to their potential, save time, and real time monitoring of activities, office of CEO adapted using powerful tools of Google i.e. Google Doc, Google sheets, and Google Forms to collect the data in a secured manner from the field. This has helped in almost avoiding the manual process of compiling information for monitoring the activities at field level

Chapter - XVIII

Media Management

In the present age of communications, media has a vital role to play in disseminating reliable, correct and quick information on elections to the public and voters. Availability of accurate, objective and complete information to enable citizens to exercise their franchise, based upon a well informed choice, is the basic requirement of free and fair elections.



Internet and Mobile Association of India (IAMAI) and Social Media Platforms (Google, Facebook, Twitter, Whatsapp, Sharechat, Tiktok) submitted a “Voluntary Code of Ethics” to ensure free, fair & ethical usage of platforms, to maintain integrity of electoral process of General Elections 2019. The Voluntary Code of Ethics came into immediate effect from the day it was presented to the Commission i.e. 20th March, 2019.

The advent of Social Media and instant messengers, smart phone applications is facilitating communication in a big way. The Commission desired that these platforms should not be misused for paid news, fake news, mis- information and disinformation during the period of the elections. Legal provisions relating to election campaigning apply to social media also in the same manner in which they apply to other forms of election campaigning in media.

The following activities were taken up engaging with the media:

- Regular media briefings by Chief Electoral Officer during Special Revision of Photo Electoral Rolls 2019 and National Voters Day 2019, and during the run up to the elections;
- Regular media briefings during the poll period – prior to each Phase of Poll, and on the poll /re-poll day;
- Chief Electoral Officer also briefed the media at short notice on important election incidents like mis-pairing of EVM-VVPAT during the 2nd phase of polls on 18th April 2019; re-enforcement measures taken up in the EVM strong rooms in view of severe cyclonic storm “FANI” etc
- Press releases during the four phase election period, highlighting the important election statistics, seizures, law and order reports etc







- A temporary Media Centre was set up at the CEO's office on the day of counting with air-conditioned facilities. The results were displaced on LED panel and CEO briefed the media persons on the trends throughout the day;
 - Photographs covering the various gamut of election activities were displayed in the media centre;
 - A WhatsApp group was created exclusively for the media persons for sharing election related news and data on real time basis
- The Media Cell was co-ordinated by Sri NiranjanSethi, Additional Director, I & P.R. Department and Sri P.K. Mallick, Information Officer to CEO, Odisha.

Results and Statistics

Declaration of Results:

The counting of votes was taken up for all the 21 PCs and 146 ACs(except 96- Patkura AC) at 8.00 AM on 23rd May 2019. Due to the newly introduced instructions regarding mandatory count of five VVPATs each for the Assembly Constituency and Assembly Segments, after the counting of votes in the CU, the declaration of results was done on the night of 23rd May and early morning of 24th May 2019. The names of the returned candidates to the Lok Sabha and to the Odisha Legislative Assembly is given in the Annexure.

Since the adjourned poll to 96- Patkura AC was held on 20th July 2019, the counting was taken up on 24th July 2019.

Election Petitions

Within the statutory periods of 45 days from the declaration of the results, 14 election petition and 5 writ petition before the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa, Cuttack. The details are given in the Annexure.

Experience Sharing, New Interventions and Suggestions

PRELIMINARY REPORT ON SIMULTANEOUS GENERAL ELECTIONS 2019**SHARING OF EXPERIENCES, INNOVATIVE STEPS TAKEN, PROBLEMS FACED
AND SUGGESTIONS SUBMITTED
TO ELECTION COMMISSION OF INDIA IN JUNE 2019****(A) INTER STATE TRANSPORTATION OF EVMs:**

EXPERIENCE: Odisha had been allocated EVMs from Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, Assam, Maharashtra, Chattisgarh and MP. ECI made bulk allocations to Odisha from different states. Once the sender States indicated their district wise delivery quantity, thereafter the district wise allocation from this Bulk allocation was key to planning in deployment of personnel from the districts. This enabled in optimal utilization of manpower which had to be deployed in each district of the sender state. The learnings and key interventions are noted below:

- (i) During the previous General Elections, often one district had to lift from multiple districts. This had made transportation of EVMs a cumbersome and tedious process. Besides, in previous elections, one officer had been deputed from each district.
- (ii) This time, Proper allocation to districts ensured that one district of Odisha was largely to receive from one district of the sender state. Besides, from each district a team of at least 3 to 4 officials were deputed for better coordination. This way, team formation, co-ordination and transportation became very easy. Generally, one district lifted EVMs from one district.
- (iii) For Inter- State transportation of EVMs, the services of Container Corporation were availed. This was very helpful in avoiding long road movements, that too of such huge quantity of EVMs. This also reduced requirement of manpower to accompany the EVMs.

SUGGESTION-1: It may be considered by Commission to ask the sender State to aggregate the EVMs at their State Central Warehouse before delivery and the delivery to the receiving State be done at the State Central Warehouse. This shall facilitate Error free delivery and smooth transportation of the EVMs. This can also help in inviting Political Parties (Recognized) to witness the entire process of Inter-State shifting of EVMs for greater transparency.

SUGGESTION-2: Inter-State movement of EVMs may be planned in such a manner that any major festivals are avoided. Our experience in UP was that the period of EVM movement coincided with the Kavadia movement. Owing to Kavadia movements, there were serious law and order problems faced in some districts. Besides, movement of vehicles was delayed, especially during the weekends. This had the effect of delaying the entire loading and rake movement.

(B) EVM VVPAT AWARENESS

INTERVENTIONS: While awareness with regards to EVMs is fairly good now, since VVPATs were being used for the first time, awareness of all stakeholders – the Candidates and Political parties, the Voters and the Election Related Officials was a big challenge before the elections. As a new equipment attached to EVMs, and with political parties ever willing to raise aspersions on the EVM system, it was absolutely necessary to educate the voters, political parties and the polling officials about the VVPAT machines. To achieve this the following interventions were made which helped tremendously:

- (i) A detailed Standard Operating protocol and Guidelines were prepared centrally by CEO Office for undertaking this massive exercise. The guidelines were all encompassing including there-in the security protocols to be followed during any movement and awareness of EVMs and VVPATs, the daily movement, number of PS/ villages to be covered each day, the protocols to be followed by the Demonstration team, safe storage each day, cost structure etc.
- (ii) Such guideline ensures clear understanding and clarity in roles and responsibilities of each stakeholder in the awareness and training team. A document had been designed to capture details of votes casted in order to keep accountability of each demo team.

- (iii) Two rounds of such awareness drive were undertaken where-in all the villages of the State were covered. In the first round approximately 30 lakh voters participated and in the second round approximately 48 lakh voters participated. The success of the effort could be gauged from the fact that during the entire 4 phases of elections, there was no complaint of people not knowing about this new machine VVPAT. There was not one news either in print or electronic medium where it was indicated that people were unaware of the Voting process and machines.
- (iv) Bi-weekly monitoring was done by capturing the movement and coverage using a Google Document. Each RO was to update the data twice every week at their level. Their emails were mapped to the google document and they could easily update their progress. The same was visible in real-time to CEO office and proved very helpful in monitoring and taking corrective measures where-ever required.

(C) CHALLENGES IN STORAGE OF EVMs AND VVPATs:

EXPERIENCE: With the inclusion of VVPAT machines, the space requirement in warehouses/ godowns/ strong rooms has increased by almost double. Such kind of floor area is not readily available in many districts. Besides, even if floor space is available at any new location, it is not necessary the such venue is approachable for heavy vehicles and is safe for storage. Such location may also not be suitable for dispersal of Polling Parties. Considering these constraints, it is imperative that the EVM storage guidelines and protocols of Commission are revisited and adapted to the changing needs due to space constraint. In this regard, a suggestion had been made by Odisha which had been approved by Hon'ble Commission. However, this may be adopted by Commission as a Standard Protocol to be followed over the entire country where-ever space constraint or any other difficulty is experienced.

- (i) Odisha had suggested for multi layered storage of EVMs and VVPAT. The storage was

to be done in Steel-racks with the number of layers being limited to three and each layer having a height of 30 inches. The foot of the Steel racks was to be grouted in floor with RCC at least 6 inches to make it strong. This enabled creation of adequate space within the existing warehouse and avoided the requirement of searching for a new warehouse and shifting.

- (ii) Such a system may not be restricted only to the warehouse but should also be extended to the Strong Rooms keeping the A, B C and D category EVMs and VVPATs. In case of Polled EVMs, the same can be kept individually with proper markings. (A sample had been shared with Commission) As for the other categories of EVMs, the same can be stored in Trunks and kept on the shelved of the Steel racks.

(D) CROSS-PAIRING OF EVMs ON POLL DAY (SIMULTANEOUS ELECTIONS ISSUES)

EXPERIENCE: A very serious and unprecedented situation occurred during the second and third phase of elections in Odisha – The Cross Pairing of EVMs and VVPATs. Since Odisha was having simultaneous elections, two sets of EVMs and VVPATs were being used in every Polling Station. Generally, at the time of commencement of Poll on the Pol Day, the pairing and connection of machines (EVMs with VVPATs) was done correctly. However, it was noticed that in case of any failure of either the VVPAT, where as per the directions of Commission, only the VVPAT is to be changed, the Cross-Pairing happened. To put it simply, suppose if the VVPAT meant for Assembly Segment of the PC was reported to be defective and required to be changed, when the Sector Officer in-charge of the reserve EVMs and VVPATs came for replacing the defective VVPAT, he replaced the Assembly Segment VVPAT with the Assembly Constituency VVPAT. As a result, when a voter pressed the button of candidate of his choice, his vote was printed by the VVPAT to another candidate. Since the AC VVPAT had been paired wrongly with AS EVMs, this was

bound to happen and had an unwarranted serious adverse impact on the credibility of the electoral process. This was purely human error, sheer negligence on the part of the Sector Officer and the Presiding Officer. All Officials responsible for such lapse have been placed under suspension and are being proceeded against.

TIMELY INTERVENTION: On the day this incident occurred (during polling in second phase), at around 2.30 PM panel discussion in local vernacular channels had just begun questioning the efficacy and effectiveness of voting machines with special focus on the traditional complaint of votes being reflected incorrectly by the VVPAT machines. Such a discussion was bound to adversely effect the entire electoral process across the State and Country and could have triggered an unwarranted discussion on the credibility of EVMs. Within 5 to 10 minutes, a Press Conference was convened by the CEO and the issue/ Human error committed by few negligent officials was explained to the general public by going LIVE on TV. Media persons were also briefed appropriately, all their queries answered to their satisfaction which ensured that TIMELY INTERVENTION, TRANSPARENCY AND ADEQUATE AND CORRECT INFORMATION ARE KEY TO SOLVING ANY CRISIS OF SUCH A MAGNITUDE.

(E) ELECTORAL ROLL

ISSUE EXPERINCED:

As per Commission's directions, soft and hard copies of the electoral roll were supplied to all recognised political parties after final publication on 21.01.2019. The same were again supplied to the contesting candidates of the parties after withdrawal of candidates in April 2019. There are 7000-8000 pages in the electoral roll of one AC. Since the mother roll and supplements are supplied again during the election in multiple 30 copies, there is huge requirement of paper. As Odisha is dependent on paper from other States, there is huge scarcity and demand before elections.

SUGGESTION:

Soft copies are supplied to all recognised political parties, and the electoral roll is available on the website, after every final publication of rolls. Wherever the period between elections and final publication is less than four months, it may be considered to supply only one hard copy to all contesting candidates of the recognised political parties, i.e. before election. The practice of giving hard copy after final publication may be dispensed with to save resources without compromising on transparency.

(F) STATUTORY AND NON- STATUTORY REPORTS OF PRESIDING OFFICERS & MATERIAL MANAGEMENT

As per extent instructions of Commission, a number of Statutory and Non- Statutory Forms have to be filled in by the Presiding Officer on the poll day. A number of certificates including the Mock Poll certificate have to be submitted. These have to be filled in and placed in separate envelopes (of different prescribed colours) and submitted to the RO at the receiving centre. About 50 different types of envelopes are printed and supplied to the Presiding Officers.

NEW INTERVENTION:

- i. In Odisha, voting compartments were supplied centrally from the CEO's Office after following a due tender procedure. Instructions had been given to all DEOs to invite tenders for procuring election materials much in advance and finalise the vendors. Orders were placed with vendors after poll announcement and supply of the same was timely.
- ii. In Odisha, a booklet containing the statutory and non-statutory forms (with the exception of Form 17 C – Accounts of votes and Form 17 A -Register of voters) to be filled in by the Presiding Officer was printed centrally at the Govt Press and supplied. The forms were perforated so that after filling it in, the Presiding Officer should place it in the prescribed envelope meant for it.

SUGGESTION:

- i. It may be considered to go for central tenders for purchase of election materials at the level of CEO as bulk purchase may be cost effective. All the materials supplied to a polling station may be packed in a single box for easy handling at the dispersal centres as done by Chattisgarh. Sufficient reserve material boxes may be supplied to Sector Officers so that in case of any additional requirement by a Presiding Officer, the same may be replenished.
- ii. Instead of having multiple envelopes for each form, which are difficult to trace out if required later, it may be considered to place all the statutory and non-statutory forms (with the exception of Form 17 C – Accounts of votes and Form 17 A -Register of voters) in a single booklet form. Wherever multiple copies are required, carbon copies can be made. The Presiding Officer should then hand over the filled in booklet to the RO at the Receiving centre in one sealed envelope. At the Receiving Centre, this booklet should be checked to ensure that all major forms/reports are duly filled in. The Presiding Officer can be asked to fill in those reports which have not been completely filled. This intervention will be user friendly to the Presiding Officer, ensure that all important and relevant information has been duly filled in, enable safe storage of all the forms in one place and facilitate easy retrieval of any information whenever required later during counting/ in course of an EP. The move will also be environment friendly.
- iii. Handbook for Returning Officer & Presiding Officer: Handbooks and Manuals may be prepared and released at least six months before poll is announced so that the same can be used for trainings and officers can get sufficient time to go through it. After poll announcement, a supplementary containing all instructions issued by Commission may be compiled and shared.

(G) POSTAL BALLOT PAPERS TO POLLING PERSONNEL

As per instructions of Commission, postal ballot papers facility should be given to all polling personnel on election duty, police personnel, drivers and cleaners.

Intervention:

In Odisha, Polling personnel data was captured six months before poll. During randomisation of polling personnel, Form 12 was given to all the polling personnel along-with auto-generated appointment orders.

A module on Postal Ballot facility was introduced in the trainings of DLMTs, DEOs and ROs. All DEOs were issued strict instructions to ensure that postal ballot facilitation centres were set up on the third round of training and at all the dispersal centres. Due to these efforts, postal ballots increased by 2.4 times i.e. from 31,000 (in GE 2014) to over 76,000 during the current elections.

SUGGESTION:

It is seen that a large number of postal ballots are rejected due to various reasons like non-signature of voter, non- attestation, placing of postal ballot not in the prescribed manner and therefore lack of secrecy etc. In future, Training of ROs and Polling personnel should be emphasised so that rejections are minimal.

It may also be considered to introduce a system of issuing E-PB to these categories of employees who are on election duty similar to the E- PBs to service voters through ETPBS.

(H) DIFFERENTIAL PHOTO VOTER SLIPS FOR PWDS AND SR. CITIZENS

Voters Slips were printed from electoral roll using ERONET application and distributed to all voters a week before the poll day.

INTERVENTION:

In Odisha, Special Vehicle Passes were printed at the DEO level as per a template designed by CEO, Odisha. These were issued to PwD voters by the BLOs under the seal and signature of the RO. The BLOs were instructed to hand it over to visually impaired voter, voter with locomotor

disability, mental disability etc who would need transport facility from his/her residence to the polling station and back. Over 5.57 lakh PwD voters flagged in the electoral roll.

SUGGESTION:

It may be considered to incorporate some changes in the ERONET, so that the Voters Slips of PwD voters flagged by the ERO/ RO, may be different (in colour or design) from the slips issued to other voters. These voters can avail of transport facility, queue jumping, wheelchair facility etc available to PwD voters.

(I) COMPLAINT MONITORING

ISSUES EXPERIENCED:

- (i) While many complaints are genuine, there are almost equal number of complaints which are extremely generic in nature without any iota substantive evidence to support the charges.
- (ii) With Electronic Media becoming an excellent source of reaching out to voters and surrogate campaigning, all Political Parties are resorting to using the Electronic and Print Media by making regular visits to CEO office, often in groups of twenty people, on the pretext of making complaints. Each Political Party is now maintaining a Team of Political Personalities at the State Headquarters who are primarily to make at least one visit to the CEO Office daily, submit a memorandum making some allegation and thereafter give long Press Bytes in the TV Channels which are regularly present during elections. In the recently concluded elections it was experienced that, some Political Parties made three visits in a day almost on a regular basis, sometimes coming to Office of CEO even at 9.30 PM in the night. At times they have even insisted that the CEO or the Additional CEO received the memorandum from them.
- (iii) Often issues which can be dealt effectively at the DEO or RO level are brought at the CEO level only to get Prime Time TV footage. As a result, institutions of DEO, RO and Observer are being bypassed as a Complaint & Grievance handling mechanism and the Office of CEO is becoming overburdened

handling the plethora of complaints. Almost 40%-50% of manhours are deputed in handling the Complaints which obviously impacts the effective Poll Management.

- (iv) Such regular visits by the Political Functionaries causes serious dislocation in the disposal of critical functions in a timely manner. Political functionaries have made the CEO office as the Battle Ground for fighting in the TV debates in the evening. In fact the Topics for Panel Discussions in the Prime-Time Evening News is decided now by submissions of such memorandums by Political Parties during the day.
- (v) The Administrative Departments of the State Government do not understand the seriousness of Election related complaints and are often found laid back in their attitude in conducting and submitting enquiry reports. This leads to avoidable waste of time by the CEO Office in pursuing with the various administrative departments.

SUGGESTIONS:

- (1) It may be considered that Political Parties be advised through ECI Instructions that routine Complaints should be handed over to a Designated Officer as declared by CEO and the Political parties shall not insist for CEO to receive every Memorandum.
- (2) The Office of the CEO should not be allowed to become the Political battle ground. Currently every Party uses the Premises of CEO for giving Bytes and this is one of the main attractions to come and submit Complaint Petitions. If Political Parties are prohibited from giving Press bytes within the premises of CEO Office, the tendency of regular visits to CEO office can be discouraged
- (3) Orientation to Administrative Heads- It is extremely important that orientation to the Administrative Heads is given on the expected nature of Complaints and required ATR way before the elections to prepare themselves at their level. Similar exercise has to be done at down the line to make the Complaint Monitoring Mechanism more fruitful and result oriented.

- (4) Discussions with Representatives of the Political Parties- It is crucial that the political parties are aware of the Commission's Guidelines and Do's and Don'ts. At the CEO and DEO Level, at least three Political party meetings must be held after the Nomination and prior to the declaration of the validly list of candidates mandatorily which should serve as a Platform for any grievance redressal.
- (5) Exemplary Punishments to act as Deterrent- It is absolutely essential that exemplary punishments to be given to the offenders in case Complaint found to be true. Similarly, the Complainant needs to be punished or warned if a false and frivolous complaint is filed. This will act as Deterrents for both reducing the unnecessary burden of the Administration.
- (6) In the First Instance, it must be mandated for a Political Party/ Candidate that all district level complaints they should submit their grievance at the Level of the General / Police / Expenditure Observers posted by the Commission. Only, if after that, the complainant is not satisfied, the Complainants should file the Complaint at the State level before CEO. This can work to save precious time and also ensure faster handling of grievance and its redressal.

(J) PRE-COUNTING OF ETPBS BALLOT PAPERS:

ISSUE EXPERIENCED:

On the counting day, due to failure of online ETPBS application, scanning of QR Codes of Form 13 C- 13A- 13B could not be done at the counting halls. After Commission's orders, the same was done manually.

SUGGESTION: E-Postal Ballot papers may have computer generated e- postal ballot paper number having unique alpha numeric code (like EPIC number) linked to the ACs. After system generation of the e- postal ballots, the number of each of the postal ballot sent to the service voter should be made available to the RO in excel sheet. At the time of counting, the RO can verify the postal ballot paper number issued to

the service voter by matching it with the excel sheet. This work can be done offline. There will be no need for online ETPBS application nor QR code scanning for the pre counting of postal ballots.

(K) ELECTION SCHEDULE

ISSUE EXPERIENCED:

In Odisha, the General Elections 2019 were held in four phases. Earlier, GE 2004, 2009 and 2014 were held in two phases. In Odisha, most of the ROs of AC have two ACs each. Due to the four phase elections, it was seen that with respect to some ROs, while it was last date of filing nomination for one AC, it was the date fixed for scrutiny of nomination for the other AC, on the same day (as the two ACs were coming under two different PCs).

INTERVENTION:

In such cases, the RO of the AC was present for scrutiny of nomination in one AC he/she authorised one of the AROs to receive the nomination on the last day of filing nomination for the other AC.

SUGGESTION:

Local festivals, suitability of poll day, other events likely to occur in an AC/ district may be taken into account for finalising the poll schedule.

(L) ELECTION PLANNER

Commission's present Election Planner has 145 items of work listed and contains all subjects / aspects related to election planning. About 18 Nodal Officers are appointed for various aspects of election management like Electoral Roll, Polling Personnel, EVM Management, EEM, MCC, Postal Ballots, Vehicle Management, Materials Management, SVEEP, C- Vigil etc

SUGGESTION:

It is suggested that separate Election Planners for each aspect of election management may be prepared. This will help the Nodal Officer of each subject to monitor the activity relating to his/her subject. This will also help the DEO/ RO to review and take stock of situation from time to time.

(M) TRAINING & CAPACITY BUILDING:**INTERVENTIONS:**

A knowledge bank of 76 SLMTs have been created in the State. These officers are having field experience as RO/ ARO/ Nodal Officers in past elections and have good knowledge of election laws. The SLMTs were deputed to various districts to observe and provided hand holding support during the district level trainings of DLMTs and Polling Personnel.

DEOs were asked to identify and depute officers having past election experience, election knowledge and good communication skills to be trained as DLMTs. Emphasis was given on institutional training and EVM hands- on. A total of 1134 DLMTs were trained in the first phase from September to December 2018 at the State level and a further 1209 in the Second phase from December to February. These DLMTs trained over 3 lakh polling personnel across the State.

Some of the SLMTs were also deputed to select districts to assist the DEOs and ROs during polling. This was well appreciated by the General Observers.

SUGGESTIONS

(i) Regular Trainings for NLMTs- Election Commission may impart training subject wise at regular intervals (to make the NLMTs abreast of latest instructions) and utilise their services as NLMTs. NLMTs/ SLMTs must be subject specific so that they have expertise in one or more field(s).

(ii) There should be one round of training of polling personnel before poll announcement. The second and third round may be done after announcement of poll.

(iii) Since the Social Media has become a platform where the Good as well as the bad news travels faster than any other medium, effective handling of Social Media will be critical in future elections. It is suggested to conduct formal training of officer's right from RO level upwards in effectively handling social media.

ICT INTERVENTIONS IN ELECTORAL PROCESS.**(M) ADAPTION OF ICT APPLICATIONS DEVELOPED BY ECI**

Odisha used the applications provided by ECI for Electoral process successfully and effectively.

ERONET: The ERONET application was used successfully during the Electoral Roll preparation. Entire process flow starting from enrolment of Electors up to printing of Electoral Roll and EPIC were captured through ERONET. This application was extremely helpful in minimising the bogus Electors and DSEs from the Electoral Roll.

NVSP: Using NVSP, citizens were able to know the status of their name in Electoral Roll, apply on line for registration as a new Elector, deletion of name from the Electoral Roll, Correction of Elector's data etc.

ERONET in combination with NVSP was extremely helpful in updating Electoral Roll during continuation up-dation period.

EMS: EVM Management System (EMS) was used for entire life cycle of EVMs during recently concluded General Election-2019. The application was used for transfer of EVMs, captures the FLC process, training, randomization, strong room management etc. Trained SLMTs have trained the DLMTs on EMS. An officer at the level of Jt. CEO was exclusively looking after the entire EVM management.

SUVIDHA: During General Election 2019, the nomination process starting from filing nomination, uploading affidavits up to form-7A generation were captured through Nomination module of **Suvidha** application. As Form-7A and Ballot paper preparation are dependent on local language, those were done separately. However, serialization of candidates and finalization of candidates were done through SUVIDHA application.

The Two Hourly Voter turnout data and final voter turnout data were captured through **SUVIDHA** application. Besides, the Electors data were also entered in the system through SUVIDHA. The application was also facilitating for Booth wise Voter turnout entry.

The round wise counting data were also captured through SUVIDHA application. The final result declaration and winner name declaration were also done through Suvidha application.

Recently, the Index Card entry provision was made available and ROs are using the same for entering Index Card data.

c-VIGIL: c-VIGIL was a new intervention that provided citizens to report MCC/Expenditure violations from the spot with pictorial evidence. Even though time fixed for resolution of complaint reported through c-VIGIL was 100 minutes, Odisha could attend average complaint resolution time as 8 hours and 30 minutes. Total 2244 cases reported and 2196 cases were attended. Altogether, 1544 cases found to be correct and successfully addressed.

ETPBS: The Service Voters Ballot paper were generated and sent to the service voters through ETPBS system as e-Postal Ballot. On counting day, the Postal ballots were validated and counted. Due to non-functioning of ETPBS, e-Postal ballot was verified and validated manually in most of the counting centres as per the directions of ECI.

LEARNINGS

- ✓ Turnout of young new Electors increased considerably, because of on-line facility provided for fresh enrolment through NVSP.
- ✓ Duplicate Electoral records can be removed easily through DSE module of ERONET.
- ✓ Healthy Electoral Roll can be maintained.
- ✓ Scheduled Revision can be eliminated through continuous updating process of Electoral roll as ERONET is open throughout year.
- ✓ The ICT intervention like SUVIDHA has helped not only in storing the data in digital form but also improved the fast dissemination of information in real time.
- ✓ IT can minimize many manual processes involved in Election Process.

OBSERVATIONS

- ✓ The applications were either running slowly or not at all running during pick period.
- ✓ The dashboard of ERONET application was not updated in real time.
- ✓ Applications are not addressing all exceptions in the process.
- ✓ In many cases, it was observed that, new modules in the application were made available to the users in the last moment that caused inconvenience to the user because there was no time or little time available for practice and testing the application module.
- ✓ Some modules do not address end to end process of the work flow.
- ✓ Some modules leave ambiguity in the process and allows partial manual process.
- ✓ Back end management of database found to be insecure and improper for which data had to be re-entered (Affidavits are uploaded again after second phase election)
- ✓ ETPBS system was not working during counting for which, the Postal ballots were verified and counted manually that took more time in counting.

SUGGESTIONS

- ✓ The hosting infrastructure should be optimized to avoid slowness during pick usage.
- ✓ A core team of resource persons with experience and domain knowledge should be formed to guide the developers so that all exceptions in the process are captured and workflow is streamlined accordingly
- ✓ Fall back mechanism may be incorporated in the system to minimize down time. One mechanism could be introduction of e-Forms for offline processing.
- ✓ Mobile app or SMS application for capturing Polling data from the booth level.
- ✓ Process of ETPBS may be relooked to minimize the complexity

(N) ICT INTERVENTIONS AT STATE LEVEL.**1. Automation of Daily Report (on Law and Order violation, MCC, and Liquor monitoring)**

During the Election process, Election Commission of India (ECI) monitors incidences of violations of law and order, violation in Modal Code of Conduct (MCC), and seizure of liquor on daily basis. A role based, process flow oriented web application was developed to monitor these activities in the State. The software was implemented in all 30 districts of the State with users from Police, Excise, District Administration who provide daily data on incidents of violence (law and order), violation of MCC, seizure of cash/liquor/other items. The reporting structure was defined prior to the implementation of software and specific timeline was given for each level of reporting.

- a. The users use the application to feed the data related to Law & order, MCC etc. by logging into the system.
- b. The data automatically goes to the State Nodal Officer (Police & Excise) and they consolidated reports using the system and forwards the same to CEO.
- c. On getting satisfactory reports from SNOs, CEO, takes the hard copy of the report and submits the same to ECI.

The following reports were generated and submitted to ECI on daily basis.

- d. LOR Form I (Incidence of Violence)
- e. LOR Form II (Seizure of Arms/Explosive, raids, execution of NBW)
- f. Annexure B8 (Seizure of Cash/Other items by Flying Squad)
- g. Annexure B9 (Report on MCC related complaints by Flying Squad)
- h. Annexure B10 (Seizure of Cash/Other items by Static Surveillance Team)
- i. Annexure B14 (Report on IMFL, Beer, Country Liquor, OS Liquor)
- j. MCC-I (Status on enforcement of MCC)
- k. MCC-II (Description and action report on major MCC violations)

Benefits of the System

- ✓ Decentralised data capture from source (SP office, Dist. Excise Office)
- ✓ Auto-consolidation of reports based on pre-defined logic
- ✓ Return option for correction of wrong data
- ✓ Availability of consolidated as well as detail report
- ✓ Centralised database to store and retrieve data as and when required

SUGGESTION:

The system will be quite helpful if office of ECE is included in the system so that the report will be processed and furnished to the commission on-line

2. MOBILE BASED VEHICLE TRACKING SYSTEM

The Sector Magistrates carry the Reserve EVMs & VVPATs with them on Poll day for replacement of defective EVM/VVPAT in Polling Station during Mock Poll/Actual Poll. As the SOs are moving from one Polling Station to other during Poll, safeguarding the EVMs is a challenging task. In order to safeguard the EVMs/VVPAT on transit, during Simultaneous General Elections-2019, the Chief Electoral Officer, Odisha implemented a real time mobile-based location and movement tracking application to track the movement of Sector Magistrates (carrying reserve EVM/VVPAT).

The system was implemented successfully in all district during Poll. Total **4361** vehicles were tracked in 4 phases of Poll.

Benefits of the system are Real time tracking, Easy implementation, no exclusive GPS device is required, and Cost-effective solution.

3. POLL DAY PUSH SMS SYSTEM

Message relating to Critical activities to minimise human error during poll were pushed through SMS on the day before the poll and Poll day. This has reduced the human errors considerably during poll. The messages were pushed to Presiding Officers, Sector officers and BLOs. The System was developed in house.

- ✓ On the day before Poll messages regarding providing facilities like sheds and drinking water, Priority Poll etc. were pushed to the BLOs and sector officers.
- ✓ On the day of Poll messages like Mock Poll process and clearing the Mock Poll Data, VVPAT slips etc. were given to the Presiding officers
- ✓ Sector officers were reminded to ensure no cross pairing of EVMs & VVPATs

Benefits of the system

1. Minimised the EVM and VVPAT clearance cases.
2. Minimised Cross Pairing of EVMs & VVPATs cases

4. Complaint Monitoring System

After enforcement of Model Code of Conduct (MCC), the complaints from various corners like Political Parties, individuals etc. are lodged in writing in the office of the CEO. CEO sends those complaints to respective DEOs for necessary compliances either by post or email or fax etc. The DEOs then submits Action Taken report to office. This process takes time and CEO is unable to monitor the progress made by the DEOs in real time basis. In order to monitor the progress of the complaint a Client Server based application was developed. CEO uploads the complaint in the system and that goes to the concerned DEO. Concerned DEO then assigns the complaint to the concerned officer. The concerned officer takes the action and uploads the ATR. CEO sees the ATR. The system was developed in house

Benefits of the system

1. Real-time monitoring of progress of the system.
2. Instant forwarding of complaints to the concerned DEO
3. Timely compliances of the complaint.

5. USAGE OF GOOGLE TOOLS IN THE ELECTORAL PROCESS (GOOGLE DOC, GOOGLE FORMS, GOOGLE SHEET)

Mountains of information, data is collected from the field level during Electoral process for monitoring various activities. Traditionally, the information was collected from the field level through FAX, email, physical letters, which takes lot of time. Precious man hours are spent in contacting and collecting and compiling information from field level by the office of CEO. This not only consumes time but also engages the resources in carrying out futile exercise.

In order to utilise the resources to their potential, save time, and real time monitoring of activities, office of CEO adapted using powerful tools of Google i.e. Google Doc, Google sheets, and Google Forms to collect the data in a secured manner from the field. This has helped in almost avoiding the manual process of compiling information for monitoring the activities at field level

A secured Google sheet was developed for capturing round wise Counting Data on counting day as a fall-back system. The Google sheet has been prepared in such a way that one user cannot see the data of other users. As and when data is entered the user can see the trend on the same sheet. The higher-level users like CEO, DEO etc can see in real time the data entered and trend at their end. This was quite effective during last general Election 2019 especially when SUVIDHA was not working may be due to excess load or low bandwidth.

GENERAL SUGGESTION ON INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY INTERVENTIONS:

ECI has done a commendable work in developing lot of applications for automating the Electoral process. Some of these applications work in isolation even though they need to interact with other applications. Each and every application adapt different user credential mechanism that forces the end user to remember each and every user credential. Following suggestions are being made to streamline the application and provide easy way of using the applications.

- ✓ All the applications need to talk to each other. Therefore, an Integrated platform need to be developed so that present application and future applications can talk to each other. A messaging middleware may be developed for this purpose
- ✓ Single Sign On mechanism may be implemented so that the end user need not remember multiple user credentials and use any application using a single credential.
- ✓ As ECI is moving towards absolute digitisation, it is proposed have its own ICT infrastructure.
- ✓ All Applications should be in HTTPS and.GOV.IN domain.
- ✓ The best practices of the state may be analysed and rolled out across the country.
- ✓ ECI may look towards Legal standing of ICT in Electoral Process.

(O)ISSUES PERTAINING TO SIMULTANEOUS ELECTIONS

(i) Odisha had conducted Simultaneous General Elections in 2019. It has been observed that many of the provisions contained in the various Handbooks such as the RO Handbook, Presiding Officers Handbook etc. is written from the point of view of Single Elections either to Lok Sabha or Legislative Assembly.

(ii) It was also observed that some of the IT applications had also been conceived for Single elections and had to be customised for Simultaneous Elections. Such customization at the last minute has its own challenges and has the tendency to lead to errors and delay in execution.

(iii) In-fact, Counting of Votes is a serious challenge in case of simultaneous elections. Given the existing instructions of Commission in the Handbook of returning Officers, the

Counting halls can ordinarily have 14 Tables plus on Table for the RO. In effect total 15 Tables. Such an arrangement in case of Simultaneous elections reduces the number of counting tables to 7 each for AS and AC. This doubles the number of rounds to be counted and ultimately delays the counting process causing strain and fatigue in the counting personnel. Currently there is no provision indicating that in case of Simultaneous elections, there can be separate counting halls for As and AC.

(iv) Currently, in the State of Odisha, the RO for the AC is also the ARO for the corresponding PC segment. Such an arrangement has been continuing for last 2 decades, but needs to be changed. During counting of votes, it was experienced that such an arrangement was leading to avoidable problems in form of monitoring and tabulation.

SUGGESTIONS:

(i) Separate Counting Halls be considered by Commission for AS and AC respectively

for counting of votes. This would restore the normal number of Tables for counting in any hall.

(ii) Similarly, the ARO of the PC segment should be an officer other than the RO of the corresponding AC. This exercise can be done by the CEO, Odisha immediately by identifying suitable officers/posts to be designated as ARO for the PC segment. This shall help when the counting halls for AS and AC are separated.

(iii) A dedicated working group must be formed for making specific suggestions to be incorporated in the various handbooks relating to Simultaneous elections. These may be incorporated in the Handbooks after due examination by the Commission.

Accordingly detail instructions and guidelines along-with Standard Operating Procedures for undertaking the Demonstration cum Awareness Programme on EVM /VVPAT has been prepared by this Office.

It may also be mentioned here that detail training of the Demonstrators shall be organized at each districts before undertaking the Demonstration and awareness campaign. Such training shall be conducted by the DLMTs already trained in this regard. In case any modifications / alteration in the proposed guidelines is desired, same may kindly be advised for incorporating the same. It may be noted that In order to ensure advance planning and arrangements by the DEOs, we are communicating these guidelines to the Districts to take necessary steps.

**DETAIL INSTRUCTIONS FOR DEMONSTRATION & AWARENESS CAMPAIGN
ON EVM & VVPAT FOR VOTER AWARENESS IN STATE OF ODISHA**

1.0 STRATEGY

- 1.1 Each Assembly Constituency in the State of Odisha has, on an average, approximately 255 to 260 numbers of polling stations.
- 1.2 There are around 97000 revenue villages within Odisha. This implies there are approximately 660 villages on average in each AC.
- 1.3 The demonstration program shall cover each revenue village so that every voter gets an opportunity to get acquainted with the EVM and VVPAT. For this purpose vehicles carrying EVMs/VVPATs will be deployed.
- 1.4 As a thumb rule, each Vehicle should have a target of covering 100 revenue villages, with covering 4 villages per day,
- 1.5 In order to ensure that each revenue village is served with reasonable time dedicated to demonstration, there will be at least 6 to 7 teams deployed for each AC.
- 1.6 On an average, each day, the demonstration team shall be working for nine hours to be calculated from Departure to Arrival from their place of starting (generally the block office).
- 1.7 The team shall start at 8 AM and return at 5 PM. This 9 hour period shall include one hour of lunch and approximately 90 minutes to 120 minutes of travel time. On any given day the team shall cover on an average, a maximum of 4 revenue villages by spending at least 90 minutes at each location.
- 1.8 With 6 to 7 teams moving simultaneously in the AC, on any given day, at least 24 to 28 villages shall be covered.
- 1.9 In this manner, it is expected to cover the entire AC covering all revenue villages in approximately 30 to 35 days period.

2.0 LOGISTICS REQUIREMENT

- 2.1 Each District Election Officer to arrange 6 numbers of Closed Hard Top vehicles of either Tata 407 type or a 6 to 7-seater vehicles like / Scorpio (preferred) for each Assembly Constituency. Hence if there are 4 ACs in that district, the DEO shall arrange for 24 to 28 numbers of vehicles depending upon number of revenue villages @ 1

vehicle per 100 villages. These vehicles should be having sufficient space to carry 4 personnel and EVM/VVPAT along-with some basic furniture.

- 2.2 The vehicles must be duly prepared with IEC materials in shape of posters which communicate important information relating to functionality of EVMs and process of voting. It must have a check-list poster for the SOP to be followed for the Mock Poll during demonstration by the team. This shall enable the mock poll voters to ensure that the process as prescribed to, is being adhered to by the team members.
- 2.3 DEO shall provide at least one sets of EVM and VVPAT machines – One for each team. Taking into consideration the possibilities of malfunctioning, at least 2 sets of BU, CU and VVPAT shall be kept reserved at Block HQrs in the safe custody under the direct supervision of concerned nodal officer.
- 2.4 The team must carry, as far as possible, foldable furniture to ensure proper placement of EVMs for the demonstration.
- 2.5 Each team shall carry one BU, one CU and one VVPAT along with extra batteries for the awareness Program.
- 2.6 The Returning Officer, in consultation with the DEO, shall prepare a detail route plan and movement schedule for each of the Six Teams. While drawing up the Route plan and movement schedule RO must ensure that the travel time is limited to a maximum of two hours and at least 6 hours are dedicated to demonstration of EVMs with additional 1 hour for lunch.
- 2.7 RO shall instruct and ensure that every Booth Level Officers locate a suitable Government or Government funded Community building, within the village, which shall necessarily be a pucca roof building, for demonstration purpose.
- 2.8 EVMs & VVPATs USED FOR SUCH DEMONSTRATION SHALL BE STORED IN A TEMPORARTY STRONG ROOM/ SAFE ROOM WHICH SHALL BE A GOVERNMENT BUILDING, PREFERABLY THE OFFICE OF THE BLOCK DEVELOPMENT OFFICER. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES, ANY EVM/VVPAT MACHINE SHALL BE STORED IN ANY PRIVATE BUILDING. IT SHALL BE THE PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY OF THE RO FOR THEIR RESPECTIVE ASSEMBLY CONSTITUENCIES TO ENSURE THAT NO EVM/VVPAT MACHINE IS EVER STORED IN ANY PRIVATE PREMISES, UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES. ANY DEVIATION TO THESE**

INSTRUCTIONS SHALL MAKE THE RO PERSONALLY LIABLE FOR PENAL ACTION.

- 2.9 RO shall identify the location for safe storage of the Demo EVM sets (BU, CU and VVPAT). Such locations, **INVARIABLY AND WITHOUT EXCEPTION SHALL BE A GOVERNMENT BUILDING AND PREFERABLY BE THE BLOCK OFFICE PREMISES.** One room preferably the Office Chamber of the Block Development Officer or the Office chamber of the ABDO shall serve as the storage room for EVMs and VVPATs. RO shall arrange for a trunk/ Almirah with provision for double lock system (BU, CU and VVPAT).
- 2.10 RO shall notify one officer of that office **NOT BELOW THE RANK OF** an extension officer who shall be responsible for the daily safe storage of the Demo EVM sets. There shall be two locks, one shall be with this notified officer and the second shall be with the BDO/ Tahsildar or any other senior officer, duly authorized by the RO in this regard.
- 2.11 The Demonstration Team shall collect the EVM sets each day from the Storage Location from the Notified Officer and return the same each day in the evening after return from demonstration. A **DAILY LOG BOOK OF EXIT AND ENTRY OF THESE EVMs and VVPATs** shall be maintained by the Nodal Officer and countersigned by the BDO/TAHSILDAR as notified by RO.
- 2.12 **THE EVM SETS SHALL NOT BE STORED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES IN THE HOUSE OR PRIVATE PREMISES OF ANY OF THE DEMONSTRATION TEAM MEMBERS OR ANYONE ELSE. IT MUST BE NOTED THAT UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES, ANY DEMO EVM SET SHALL BE STORED IN ANY OTHER LOCATION, EXCEPT THE ONE NOTIFIED BY THE RETURNING OFFICER.**
- 2.13 Before commencement of the Demonstration Program, RO shall personally ensure wide-scale publicity of the demonstration schedule. He must involve the BLOs/BLAs concerned who must be instructed to sensitize about the Program well in advance through posters/banners at important places of congregation (Panchayat Building, School Building, Market places, Haats & other conspicuous places etc.). Public Address system and other modes of mass communication must be used for ensuring wide publicity.

3.0 MANPOWER ARRANGEMENTS

- 3.1 As discussed above, there shall be 6 to 7 dedicated teams deployed for demonstration in each Assembly Constituency. Each team shall consist of a team of 5 persons including one security guard.
- 3.2 Each team shall consist of two officers preferably senior block level functionaries and in no case below the rank of Block Level Extension Officers duly trained on the Functionality of EVMs and process of Mock Poll. Each district now has trained DLMTs specifically for handling of EVM/ VVPAT. These trained DLMTs are to train the officers involved in the Demo. In case necessary, the DLMTs may also be used in the Demonstration team. There shall be two class-IV employees to assist along with one armed police personnel for security of EVMs.
- 3.3 Each of the Team members shall be duly notified by the Returning Officer by way of office order and such officers shall ordinarily continue till the completion of the entire period of demonstration. Any change shall be done only in exceptional circumstances and only after express written permission of the District Election Officer.

4.0 ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

4.1 1st Demo Officer: Shall be responsible for:

- (a) Ensuring safe and secure connection of the EVM and VVPAT
- (b) Clearing the mock poll data of previous station.
- (c) Shall be in-charge of the Control Unit of the EVM.
- (d) Explaining the functionality of each of the machines and the entire process of Mock Poll.
- (e) Shall press the ready button on the CU at the time of mock poll.
- (f) He shall be responsible for counting of votes in the CU after the mock poll and tallying the same with the records maintained by the 2nd officer in the Pre-Printed format.
- (g) He shall clear the Mock Poll Data from the CU by following the Close – Result – Clear sequence and empty the VVPAT of the Paper Slips.

5.0 MISCELLANEOUS

- 5.1 Civil Society Organizations like NSS/ NYK/ ELC/ ZKSS/ BKSS may be involved in ensuring wide publicity and mobilization. In particular, their services should be utilized for mobilizing few People with Disability to the demonstration cum Mock Poll venue.
- 5.2 Care must be taken while using VVPAT. It should not be exposed to direct light nor to extensive dust or sun. Any connection/disconnection of wire to VVPAT must be done after switching off the control unit (C.U)
- 5.3 The BLO may be instructed to arrange public address system like mike/ sound system for the awareness Program. Leaflets if required may also be distributed at the site of the awareness Program where the date and time should be clearly mentioned
- 5.4 One educative poster on EVM/ VVPAT has to be fixed at each polling location for follow up awareness Program purpose.
- 5.5 DEOs shall ensure requisitioning of vehicles through the R.T.O concerned with payments at the duly approved rates.
- 5.6 The designated vehicle for the demonstration purpose should have the posters of EVM & VVPAT for the awareness of voters. A standard material in this regard shall be provided by the office of CEO, Odisha which shall be printed locally and affixed on the Demo Vehicles.
- 5.7 **THE STANDARD DO'S AND DON'TS AS COMMUNICATED BY THE ELECTION COMMISSION OF INDIA MUST BE STRICTLY ADHERED TO.**
- 5.8 **NO MACHINE, WHICH HAS NOT UNDERGONE FLC OR WHICH IS FLC NOT-OK SHALL NOT REPEAT SHALL NOT BE USED FOR TRAINING AND DEMONSTRATION PURPOSES.**
- 5.9 **THE DUMMY BALLOT PAPER ALONG WITH THE DUMMY SYMBOLS AS PRESCRIBED BY THE COMMISSION SHALL ONLY BE USED FOR TRAINING AND DEMONSTRATION PURPOSES.**
- 5.10 **THE MACHINES SHALL NOT BE STORED AT ANY PLACE OTHER THAN THE DESIGNATED TEMPORARY STRONG ROOM AS DECLARED BY THE DEO.**
- 5.11 **THE DEMONSTRATION AND MOCK POLL SHALL BE DONE ONLY AND ONLY IN GOVERNMENT BUILDING AND NOT IN ANY PRIVATE BUILDING.**

(h) He shall ensure that the Knob of the VVPAT is placed in the "LOCK" position before travel to the next booth.

4.2 2nd Demo Officer: Shall be responsible for:

(a) Arranging logistical support like tables chairs lighting etc. in the Mock Poll demonstration centre.

(b) Filling up the Check-List card before commencement of the Mock Poll. He shall cross verify from the CU and VVPAT that the mock poll data of previous station has been cleared from the CU and the Paper slips from the VVPAT have been removed before commencement of Mock poll.

(c) There shall be a Check List card which shall be filled up by the 2nd officer and duly signed in token of having checked the machines to be ready for mock poll.

(d) During the mock poll, this officer shall fill up the pre-printed format recording there-in the name of voter who has voted and the symbol against which he/she has casted his/ her vote, in a sequential order.

(e) At the end of the mock poll, this officer shall tally the total VVPAT slips and candidate wise votes polled with the entries made by him in the Pre-Printed format and ensure that the results are tallying. He shall sign the Pre-Printed format and obtain signature of two voters in token of successful Mock Poll.

(f) Shall keep all such Pre-Printed format records and handover the same to the Notified Officer at the Block headquarter in-charge of safe storage in the evening upon return.

The above responsibilities shall be discharged at every location by these two officers.

4.3 Class IV staff shall be responsible for:

(a) Upon arrival in the village, shall immediately move in the village and mobilize the voters to congregate at the Mock Poll cum demonstration venue.

(b) Shall arrange logistics such as tables, chairs, lights etc. with the help of BLO.

(c) Carrying of EVM sets, setting up of the EVMs. Maintaining order at the venue, ensuring orderly queue for conduct of mock poll, and all such activities as may be assigned by the officers for ensuring smooth conduct of the Demonstration cum Mock Poll.

5.12 A CHECK LIST OF POSSIBLE MISTAKES SHALL BE SHARED WITH THE DISTRICTS.

5.13 There shall be a standard format (EVM/VVPAT DEMONSTRATION SHEET) of one page to be filled up at each booth after arrival and before departure. It shall capture time of arrival, certificate that the EVM & VVPAT has been duly checked before commencing demonstration, after the mock poll the results in CU and VVPATs have been shown to the people and that it has matched. Signature of two voters be obtained in token of their satisfaction. Time of arrival and departure must be captured. On the reverse of the format, the names of voters be recorded who voted. This document shall be filled by the officer at each and every booth and submitted at the strong room each evening.

5.14 The expenditure incurred for the purpose shall be met out of the funds earmarked under the Head 104 – Charges for Conduct of Joint Elections of Lok Sabha and State Legislative Assembly/UT (Other than Police Arrangement).

6.0 STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE DURING DEMONSTRATION CUM MOCK POLL

6.1 Each morning, after receiving the EVM sets and before setting out for awareness and demonstration the demo officers shall check the machines for its functionality and integrity. While doing so they shall check the following:

6.2 Before Dispersal in the morning from the strong room:

- (a) Switch on the machines and check that batteries are functional. The display unit of CU & VSDU is fully functional and power packs are having adequate reserve power.
- (b) The VVPAT has adequate length of paper roll for printing at least 600 slips. In case of shortage, additional paper roll be carried.
- (c) All data in the CU from the previous day has been cleared. Similarly, all paper slips from the VVPAT slip compartment has been removed.
- (d) Ensure that the Temporary strong room nodal officer has made due entries in the EVM/VVPAT Log Book about the previous day's entry and present day exit entry. Sign the Log Book in token of confirmation.

- (e) Check the route plan, list of villages to be covered, ensure all team members are together. **DO NOT LEAVE FOR DEMONSTRATION WITHOUT THE SECURITY PERSONNEL.**
- (f) Mark a start time in the village visit format before departure from Temporary Strong Room.

6.3 Before departure to the next polling station

- (g) All data in the CU from the previous day has been cleared. Similarly, all paper slips from the VVPAT slip compartment has been removed.
- (h) The display unit of CU & VSDU is fully functional and power packs are having adequate reserve power.
- (i) Mark a start time in the **VILLAGE EVM/VVPAT DEMONSTRATION SHEET** (Annexure A) before departure from the booth.
- (j) Fill up the **VILLAGE EVM/VVPAT DEMONSTRATION SHEET** before departure from the Village and obtain the signatures of at least 2 voters who have voted as a token of their satisfaction.
- (k) In case the voters present demand another round of mock poll, their demand, as far as possible may preferably be complied with. However, the team shall take a final decision based on the facts and circumstances of the location and time.
- (l) The teams must ensure that their departure for return to Temporary Strong Room happens before sunset.

6.4 After return to Temporary Strong Room after Demonstration:

- (m) Clear all data of mock poll and clear all VVPAT slips. Deposit Village wise VVPAT slips in separate envelope indicating therein – Name of Village, Name of GP, Number of votes casted, number of VVPAT slips inside the envelope.
- (n) Submit the **VILLAGE EVM/VVPAT DEMONSTRATION SHEET** for each of the villages visited during the course of day.
- (o) Ensure the Temporary Strong Room Nodal Officer has made due entries in the Log Book about the safe return of the EVMs and VVPATs. Sign the Log Book as a token of confirmation.

BJD seeks close watch on fuel pumps, gas agencies

These units could be used for hoarding cash during polls, alleges BJD

ALLEGING that it was a possibility of huge cash hoarding by BJD through petrol pumps and gas agencies to influence voters, the ruling BJD on Tuesday demanded a strict surveillance and monitoring of all these units to ensure free and fair polls in Odisha.

In a meeting convened by Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) Surendra Kumar, a delegation of BJD leaders alleged that unless all petrol and gas agencies are taken under strict surveillance, the units could be used to hoard cash during

polls by Union Minister for Petroleum and Natural Gas Dharmendra Pradhan. "The personnel of these agencies are likely to be used to hoard cash and agencies are difficult to check during polls in the public interest and it is in the public interest to take the strict surveillance and monitoring of these units to ensure free and fair polls in Odisha."

The BJD leaders alleged that during the election in Biju State Assembly election last year, huge amount of cash was seized from petrol pump owners and their managers. "The high alert was kept in view of petrol pumps and gas agencies as cash hoarding and distribution

points during the by-polls," the memorandum alleged and added that misuse of these units is a real threat during the upcoming elections.

Alleging that in such case, those who indulge in such illegal activities during the poll, the CEO delegation urged that the strict vigil be maintained in the upcoming elections. The CEO demanded that the amount of cash hoarded in such units should be checked and if found to be hoarded in violation of the provisions of the law, the agencies should be reported to the police for strict action.

The memorandum also demanded that persons of such nature should be reported to the police for strict action.

The BJD delegation included Lok Sabha Member Kailash Nayak, former minister Pushpakant Singh, party MP Anil Kumar, Union Minister Pradeep Kumar and spokesperson Biju Datta.

Candidates to advertise criminal records thrice

CHIEF Electoral Officer (CEO) of Odisha Surendra Kumar on Tuesday said candidates of all political parties contesting the upcoming Lok Sabha and Assembly polls will have to publish their criminal records in print and electronic media and disclose their Income Tax return for the last five years in their election affidavits.

Kumar, who convened a meeting with all political parties of the State to seek their cooperation and inform them about new rules and provisions of Election Commission of India (ECI), said criminal records of a candidate must include details regarding pending cases. "Candidates will have to publish their criminal records thrice anytime during the nomination process and campaigning period," he said.

The cost of publication of the criminal antecedents will be added to the expenditure of the candidates concerned. Besides, candidates will have to share details about their foreign assets and li-

abilities, if any, as well as movable and immovable assets in their affidavits. Candidates filing nomination papers will also be required to reveal their Permanent Account Number (PAN).

The meeting was attended by representatives of eight political parties including the ruling BJD, BJP, Congress, BSP, CPI and CPM. With the Model Code of Conduct coming into force, Kumar spell out the 'dos and don'ts' to be followed by political parties during this period. He said the Election Commission will keep a strict vigil on the poll expenditure of candidates. "Two separate poll expense registers will be maintained by the candidate and Assistant Expenditure Observers. In case of any mismatch in the expenditure figure, the candidate will be asked to give an explanation," he said.

The CEO said the Income Tax department has come up with a helpline number, which will be announced in a day or two, to allow public and political parties to report about irregularities in poll expenditure by a candidate.

Carry proof for cash above ₹50,000, EC cautions

Community and social functions will be under the watch of EC

THE Election Commission has cautioned people to have valid document if they are carrying cash above ₹50,000 and gift articles over ₹10,000. The EC, however, said no document will be required for cash below ₹50,000.

"The unexplained cash above ₹50,000 will be seized and released only after it is proven that it has nothing to do with the elections. If the seized amount from any individual is above ₹10 lakh, it will be referred to the Income Tax Department for inquiry," said Harshdeep Mishra, Additional Secretary in the office of State Chief Electoral Officer (CEO).

"Persons carrying cash above the fixed limit will have to explain its source and where it is taken to. The District collectors too have been asked by the Election Commission to take

necessary measures in this regard," said Mishra.

The Election Commission of India will also keep an eye on community and social functions to ensure that it is not funded by a political party.

Odisha said the expenditure observers, surveillance teams, flying squads and police are on duty in the State after enforcement of model code of conduct which will remain effective till the end of polling process.

The Election Commission of India is strictly monitoring appointment of squads and observers.

"Squads and observers have been appointed by the EC at Lok Sabha constituencies as well as Assembly constituencies. Besides there are also police observers who will keep eye on poll procedures," said Additional Chief Electoral Officer for Odisha Sachin Ramdasrao Jadhav.

'STATE ICONS' TO SPREAD VOTER AWARENESS

CHIEF Electoral Officer (CEO) Surendra Kumar has shortlisted the names of six personalities from Odisha who will be appointed as 'State Icons' to spread awareness among voters and conduct sensitisation drives for the ensuing Assembly and Lok Sabha Elections.

They are sprinter Dutee Chand, para athlete Jayanti Bohera, para shuttler Pramod Bhagat, singer Rituraj Mohanty and cine artistes Sivani San-

gita and Swaraj. The six have been shortlisted under Systematic Voter's Education and Electoral Participation (SVEEP) programme.

The CEO has sent the list of these 'State icons' to the Election Commission of India for approval. "These icons will be involved in voter awareness programmes to encourage young and new voters to cast their ballot in the upcoming elections," Kumar said after a meeting of the State level SVEEP committee here on Monday.

The State level SVEEP committee has been formed to monitor various voters awareness campaigns in Odisha. "As a special measure, we will soon come up with television programmes and radio jingles on voters' awareness in Desia, Sambalpur and Santali languages. Artists and theatre groups working at district and block levels will also be roped in for sensitisation drives," he said.

In a bid to encourage voters to exercise their franchise in the elections, the Election Commission has formed SVEEP

committees at district level as well as at 2,908 schools and 665 colleges across the State. It has also set up 21,385 'Chunav Pathshalas' across Odisha to educate people about functioning of VVPATs and EVMs.

Kumar said as part of the voter awareness campaign, mock polling are being conducted across the State. While the first round of mock polling, which started in January, is over, the second round is continuing. "If required, we will conduct another round of mock polling in the State," he added.

REPOLLING was held in two booths in Berhampur and Malkangiri on Thursday.

As many as 534 votes were polled till 5.30 pm in booth 63 at City High School where repolling was necessitated due to mismatch in number of voters and voter turnout during first phase on April 11.

After polling for Berhampur Lok Sabha constituency and seven Assembly segments under it in the first phase, it was found out that against presence of 611 voters in Ward 16 of Berhampur, 632 voters were polled in the booth. Returning officer Diganth Routray informed the State Election Commission which directed for repolling in the booth. Since the voters

already had the poll ink marked on their forefinger, they got their middle finger marked after casting their votes again on Thursday.

Repolling was held amid thick security cover and presence of election observers.

In booth 254 of Malkangiri Assembly segment, 76 per cent voter turnout was recorded during repolling. Here, irate villagers had damaged the EVM and other polling materials on April 11, alleging that the mandatory CRC (Close-Result-Clear) procedure was not followed by polling officials.

Of the total 823 registered voters, 626 voted in the booth located in MPV-65 village that is dominated by Bengali community. Since it is a Maoist affected area, polling started at 7 am and closed at 4 pm.

CEO directive to political parties on poll expenses

WITH crores of rupees being spent for campaigning ahead of the Assembly and Lok Sabha polls, the Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) for Odisha Surendra Kumar on Saturday asked political parties and candidates to maintain a proper record of their election expenditures.

Convening a meeting with the regional parties, in line with the meeting of Election Commission (EC) with National parties ahead of polls, the CEO advised all political parties and candidates to maintain an expense register related to their poll expenditure.

As per EC's direction, two separate poll expense registers of each candidate will be maintained by the candidate and the Assistant Expenditure Observers. In case of any mismatch in the expenditure figure the candidate will be called for an explanation.

The CEO said the Commission has kept an eye on the expenditure of candidates contesting the polls. To prevent any kind of suspicious transactions and use of money to influence voters, the flying squads have seized ₹2.19 crore. The Excise squad of the Commission have also seized over one lakh litres of liquor worth ₹3.19 crore.

Excise officials informed that 1.32 lakh litre liquor has been seized so far and 2,140 people have been arrested and forwarded to court. Besides, they said around 1.37 crore hemp plants have been destroyed and 4.5 kg brown sugar seized by March end.

EC keeping a tab on candidates with criminal records

THE Election Commission (EC) has warned that candidates not mentioning their criminal records in the media during electioneering will have to face contempt of court proceedings.

Additional Chief Electoral Officer Sachin Ramchandra Jadau said they are keeping track of the candidates with criminal antecedents to find out whether they are publishing their criminal records in media or not.

"We will report to the Commission against those who have failed to mention their criminal record thrice between the period of filing nomination and campaigning," Jadau said.

As many as 26 Lok Sabha and 191 Assembly candidates were in the fray for the first phase polls conducted in Berhampur, Koraput, Nabarangpur and Kalahandi Parliamentary constituencies and 28 Assembly segments in the State. The Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) report had stated that around 75 per cent of BJP candidates and 50 per

cent of Congress candidates, who were in fray for the Phase-I Lok Sabha elections in the State, had criminal cases pending against them.

The ADR report had also revealed that 16 out of 28 candidates from Congress, 11 of 28 from BJP, nine of 28 nominees from BJD and two of 22 BSP candidates contesting first phase Assembly polls had declared pending cases against them in their affidavits.

However, sources said, more than a dozen candidates with pending cases, who had contested the polls in the first phase, are yet to inform the district election officers about publication of their criminal records in media during electioneering as mandated by the Commission.

The EC had implemented the move following a directive from the Supreme Court in this regard. As per the new provision, candidates contesting the General Elections have to advertise their criminal antecedents in TV channels and newspapers at least three times during electioneering.

HOURS before the second phase polls, Maoist violence rocked Kandhamal district where Left Wing extremists allegedly gunned down a woman polling supervisor and set ablaze a vehicle on Wednesday.

Polling supervisor Sanjukta Digal, a Gram Rojgar Sevak, was shot in the head near Barahala village under Gochhapada police limits when their vehicle had stopped following a landmine explosion.

Assistant sector officer Prakash Chandra Dash, who was accompanying her, was also injured.

from the spot after hearing the explosion. There were five polling supervisors inside the vehicle.

"The landmine exploded just before our vehicle reached the spot. The whole area was covered in dust and smoke after the blast and we were unable to see one another. Sanjukta was hit by a bullet in the head. We suspect they were targeting our vehicle. Fortunately, four of us managed to escape unhurt," Dash said.

Though a grievously injured Sanjukta was immediately rushed to nearby hospital, she was declared brought dead.

SC orders 5-fold rise in VVPAT match

IN a bid to instil confidence among voters and political parties about the use of EVMs, the Supreme Court on Monday asked the Election Commission to increase the number of EVMs to be matched against Voter-Verified Paper Audit Trail (VVPAT) slips from one to five per constituency.

The Supreme Court's order came on a plea by Opposition parties demanding 50 per cent of EVMs to be matched against VVPATs. The poll panel objected to this demand saying it could delay results by up to five days. However, now that the SC has increased it only from one machine to five, the delay may be only around an hour.

A bench headed by CJI Ranjan Gogoi maintained the num-

ber of EVMs for physical verification with the paper audit trails was being hiked to bring in greater degree of satisfaction in the electoral process.

This order, the court clari-

fied, is not pointing towards any deficiency in the existing system whereby the Election Commission picks up one EVM every constituency for matching the votes with the paper audit trails. It said, "If the number of (VVPAT) machines can be increased to a reasonable number, it would lead to greater satisfaction, so the endeavour of the court is to find a viable number of VVPATs."

The bench also directed the poll panel that the EVMs shall continue to be picked up randomly and added that the existing setup of having five officials from the Election Commission should be able to carry out this direction effectively. During the hearing, the EC had told the apex court that increasing the random checking would require more workforce.

Odisha: 68 pc and still counting

WITH no reports of violence, Odisha recorded over 68 per cent (pc) voter turnout till the last reports came in from first phase simultaneous polls held across four Parliamentary Constituencies (PCs) and 28 Assembly segments on Thursday. While it is at least six pc less than the previous elections, the numbers are slated to surge since final reports from the constituencies were awaited. Nabarangpur PC may see voters turnout soar past 80 pc mark.

In 2014, as many as 74.67 pc voters had exercised their franchise in the four PCs. However, polling, by and large, was smooth and peaceful with stray incidents of EVM malfunction. Sources said polling was delayed by nearly an hour in Jeypore Municipality, Jodi village under Meerabali panchayat and Bhakurguda under Kottapeta panchayat in Rayagada district as the EVMs were found defunct. Voting was resumed after the machines were replaced.

Though polling was to be conducted from 7 am to 4 pm in 20 of 28 Assembly segments which are affected by Left wing extremism and in rest of the constituencies till 6 pm, long queues were witnessed in front of many booths till late in the evening.

THE Election Commission of India (ECI) on Monday issued notification for first phase polls in the State beginning April 11.

Four Lok Sabha constituencies of Berhampur, Koraput, Kalahandi and Nabarangpur as well as 28 Assembly segments will go to polls in the first phase.

As per the notification, filing of nominations commenced from Monday and will continue till March 25. Candidates can file nominations between 11 am and 3 pm on any working days during this period. Scrutiny of nomination papers of candidates will be done on March 26 and the last date of withdrawal of nomination is March 28.

Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) of Odisha Surendra Kumar said notification for the second phase elections to five Lok Sabha and 35 Assembly constituencies will be issued on Tuesday.

For the first time, elections in the State will be held in four phases.

Notification for the third and fourth phase polls will be issued on March 28 and April 2 respectively.

Meanwhile, on the basis of the CEO's recommendations, the ECI has revised voting time of polling booths in Left Wing Extremism (LWE)-affected areas during the first phase polls.

Voting time at polling booths in all Assembly segments under Kalahandi Parliamentary constituency will be 7 am to 4 pm. In Nabarangpur Lok Sabha constituency, voting time in all Assembly segments except Nabarangpur will be 7 am to 4 pm. Voting time of Nabarangpur Assembly segment will be 7 am to 6 pm.

174 LS, 1,137 Assembly candidates in fray

ELECTION Commission (EC) officials on Saturday said a total of 174 candidates for Lok Sabha constituencies and 1,137 for Assembly segments are in fray for the four phase General Elections in Odisha.

While the fate of 26 Lok Sabha and 191 Assembly candidates has already been sealed in the Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) in first phase polls on April 11, a total of 148 Lok Sabha aspirants and 946 Assembly candidates will contest the elections in the remaining three phases on April 18, 23 and 29 respectively.

EC officials said strong enforcement measures are be-

ing taken to ensure free and fair polls in the State. The flying squad of the commission has seized unaccounted cash worth over ₹3 crore during raids so far. Enforcing the Model Code of Conduct, the EC has also removed over 30 lakh boardings, banners and posters from various localities across the State.

Chief Electoral Officer for Odisha Surendra Kumar said the control room opened in his office to address poll related grievances, has so far received around 806 complaints pertaining to election irregularities in different Lok Sabha and Assembly constituencies.

Stage set for polling in 4 LS seats in Odisha

ELABORATE arrangements are in place for the first phase polls for four Lok Sabha and 28 Assembly seats in Odisha on Thursday.

Elections for the first phase will be held in Koraput, Nabarangpur, Kalahandi and Berhampur Parliamentary constituencies and their Assembly segments. More than 60 lakh voters will exercise their franchise to decide the fate of 26 Lok Sabha and 191 Assembly candidates.

Election Commission officials said a total of 60,05,707 voters comprising 29,72,925 male, 30,30,222 female and 560 transgenders will cast their votes in 7,233 booths.

With Left Wing Extremism activities remaining a major concern in the Lok Sabha and Assembly constituencies going to polls in the first phase, Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) Surendra Kumar said tight security have been made to ensure smooth conduct of polls.

The Central Armed Police Force (CAPF) personnel and State police deployed on bordering districts have been put on high alert in the wake of Maoist attack in neighbouring Chhattisgarh on Tuesday in which five persons, including an M.L.A, were killed.

Polling time has been revised for some constituencies. In Kalahandi Lok Sabha constituency, voting time at polling booths in all the Assembly segments will be from 7 am to 4 pm. In Nabarangpur Lok Sabha constituency, voting time in all Assembly segments, except Nabarangpur, will be from 7 am to 4 pm. Voting time of Nabarangpur Assembly segment will be from 7 am to 6 pm.

In Berhampur, polling time will be from 7 am to 6 pm in all Assembly segments except

Mohana, where the voting time will be from 7 am to 4 pm. In Koraput Lok Sabha constituency, the polling time will be from 7 am to 4 pm in all Assembly segments except Jeypore, where the timing will be from 7 am to 6 pm.

The Election Commission has identified 2,375 sensitive polling stations in the first phase. As many as 777 of these polling stations will be guarded by CAPF personnel while 215 stations will be under CCTV surveillance.

Two helicopters will be used to take polling personnel to highly sensitive polling booths in Swabhiman Anchal (former cut-off areas of Malkangiri) and other constituencies to ensure security of polling parties. A total 47,805 polling personnel, including 690 women polling officials, have been engaged for the first phase polls.

The CEO said flying squads, static surveillance teams, poll observers and police and excise sleuths will be deployed in all Assembly constituencies to ensure that elections are conducted in a free, fair and transparent manner.
